
Betty Ann led us in the singing and playing of "O Canada" and our "4 Way Test Song".

PROGRAM



Asit Sarkar introduced our speaker, Jasmine Calix. Jasmine was born in Moose Jaw where she received her primary and secondary education. Jasmine has resided in Saskatoon for the past 15 years and has worked for all levels of government. Currently she is the Executive Director of Immigration Partnership Saskatoon.

The Immigration Partnership Saskatoon (IPS) is a multi-sectoral partnership involving 70 local organizations working on shared awareness and leadership to create enabling environments for collective action designed to attract, settle, and integrate newcomers to Saskatoon.


IPS Partners include the City of Saskatoon, local Universities and colleges, the three school boards, employers and employer associations, settlement, human and Health service providers, regional planning bodies, faith and ethnocultural sectors, justice and police, and First Nations/Metis.

Immigration Partnership Saskatoon is a Local Immigration partnership – or a LIP, which is an initiative designed by Immigration, Refugees and Citizenship Canada (IRCC) to develop a community-based approach to facilitate the integration of newcomers into Canada. LIPs bring stakeholders who are not typically a part of the settlement process for immigrants and refugees to successfully welcome and integrate newcomers through a unique multi-level governance structure involving municipal, provincial, and federal partners.

LIPs begun in 2008 and there are now over 70 LIPs across the country, 4 of which are in Saskatchewan. The Partnership Council is made up of high-level executives from sectors across the community, including all levels of government. LIPs do not provide direct service to clients but rather work at the level of policy and systems. The City of Saskatoon is the collective impact backbone organization for Saskatoon LIP.

IPS began in Saskatoon in 2017 and Jasmine began works there in February 2021.

The yearly number of immigrants to Saskatoon is approximately 3700. The following charts illustrate some of the immigrant profile.



There was discussion about how our Rotary club can help immigrant settlement and what the club is currently doing.
