PROGRAM

Asit Sarkar introduced our speaker Lokpriy Shrma who is a Post Doctoral Fellow at the Johnson/Shoyama School of Business. Lokpriy earned a Fulbright scholarship to study in the US, worked for the Indian government and recently worked for the City of Saskatoon.

Lokpriy coauthored a study entitled "Women in COVID-19 Recession:Employment, Disproportionate Job Loss and Wage Loss in Canada". This was the topic of his presentation.

Through a series of graphs Dr. Shrma demonstrated that women fared poorer than men during the pandemic in terms of job loss and income loss.

The paper had the following recommendations to prevent this from happening during future events of this nature.

- Provide training to women employed in hard hit sectors
- Introduce a mixed system of parental leave policies that encourage men to take on more childcare responsibilities, including individual nontransferable paternity leave.
- Implement Canada-wide Early Learning and Child Care Plan
- Provincial pay equity and transparency measures to complement and strengthen the federal Pay Equity Act



- Maintain pandemic pay wage increases for frontline workers
