She noted that her organization had formerly been the Council for Crippled Children until 1989. Emily outlined the comprehensiveness of her organization including SARCAN; Camp Easter Seal; vocational and recreation programs, training centres to mention the main functions. Camp Easter Seal sits on 100 acres of property at Manitou Beach and is home to a grand chalet and dining hall, 14 cabins (all with heat and a/c), a newly renovated aquatic centre and a waterfront and boating area.

Sarcan is owned by Sask Abilities and is now located on Jasper Avenue and the Sask Abilities provincial resource centre is located on Louise Street. Facilities are also located In Regina, Swift Current and Yorkton and they operate 2 group homes.

Kim expressed our appreciation to Emily for her presentation and emphasized how we were amazed at the many avenues of the enterprise!

Candace noted that Saskatoon is hosting the 2023 District Conference in May of 2023 with the theme "ImagineAction". There will be a Wanuskewin supper with speakers included in the weekend.
