Program - Kim Horan - Technology Questions



Jim Blackburn introduced Kim Horan, our own in-house tech support guy. Kim graduated from the Royal Military College and worked in industry for a number of years before forming Horan Consulting. His remarks focused on ransomware - what it is and how to avoid it. Ransomware is a malicious software that takes control of the data on your computer. You will be asked to pay a ransom to regain access to your computer. Don't pay. In most cases you will not get your data back even if you do. Even large institutions have been caught by ransomware. To avoid it, keep your virus protection up to date and make sure you back everything up in a separate location, such as the cloud. Kim recommended routinely backing up your "system image" which will allow you to quickly restore your computer if it is taken over. Joe Dierker expressed the club's thanks.
