Program July 20, 2009

Gary Rusu introduced our guest speaker Jonathan Stockdale.

Jonathan was born and raised in La Ronge. After graduating from high school in 2002, Jonathan pursued a degree in civil engineering at the U of S. In 2006 Jonathan spent 4 months in the Northern Region of Ghana on a volunteer placement with Engineers without borders. Upon returning to Saskatoon, Jonathan graduated from the U of S and started his engineering career at Cameco. After working for 1 year in Cameco's geo-environmental department, Jonathan returned to Africa to travel for 3 months.

Since arriving back from Africa, Jonathan has been working with Saskatchewan Alternative Initiatives and preparing to return to the U of S to pursue a degree in Law. Jonathan spoke to the club about the NGO, Health Aid Youth Club (H.A.Y.C.) which he came across while in Ghana. H.A.Y.C. impressed Jonathan because of its large impact on a small budget.

Ghana is one of the most underdeveloped countries in world. Northern Ghana is very undeveloped as compared to the south. Poor infrastructure, health markets. Very dry in the north so agriculture is very difficult. People are friendly, outgoing, and peaceful.

"Health Aid" was started 10 years ago by Dr. Diego in the Seboba area. 100,000 people and one doctor providing health services. "Health Aid Youth Club" which is a sub-organization of Health Aid was started April 2008. Health Aid has local support. They are starting a bank in the next year or two. Dr. Diego wants help from Jonathon in starting an agriculture program. HAYC is the only NGO that is run entirely by volunteers. No paid staff. Derek Tumanja is a friend of Jonathon's and is his local contact in Ghana. He helps manage funds and projects. Derek will be using Jonathon's camera to make a documentary in Ghana.

HYAC activities:

- presentations in outlying communities

- 7 different schools involved

- 2,700 members

- The program has 5 computers from Italy and runs a small computer program

- HIV Prevention, dental, family, planning, hygiene, malaria

prevention

- Local members are getting leadership & presentation skills.

Fundraising objective - \$5800 - Bed nets, garbage cans, fuel to get to remote area.

The HAYC fundraising request to our club = 1/7th of \$5800. Jonathon also mentioned that the club should consider funding Engineers Without Borders as they are an effective organization.
