Program July 27, 2009

Gary Kerr introduced our guest speaker Tom Sargeant.

Tom began his remarks by moving the microphone to one side. Heck, he's a football coach, former teacher and current high school principal - he doesn't need a microphone!

Tom gave a speech laden with humour, genuinely wonderful comments about young people and kudos to our club for the Restorative Action Program at Bedford Road Collegiate.

Earlier in his career Tom taught at Bedford Road and he is very pleased to be back in the school going into his second year as principal. Bedford Road Collegiate is a very special place with a long and storied history and legions of very proud graduates dating back to 1923. "RAP is really making a difference at Bedford," said Tom. The fact he does not see a line up of problem students outside his office is a testament to the program.

He made an interesting observation in comparing the students at Centennial Collegiate (where he served as vice-principal for two years), to the students at Bedford Road. Students at Centennial almost have a sense of entitlement and are much more demanding than those at Bedford. Bedford students "learn to play in the same sandbox, set boundaries and communicate well."

Tom concluded his remarks by switching hats and speaking about his 26 years of coaching with the Saskatoon Hilltops. He joked that he met his wife through the football club and that's been a definite bonus because she thinks it's normal for football to play such a large role in their lives!

The Hilltops have been around since 1946 with their slogan - "to turn boys into men." Tom and the rest of the coaching staff work with 18 to 22 year olds and even compete with the U of S Huskies for players. Last year the Hilltops were the team to beat in Canada. "Hungry and humble" was their mantra. This season they've had to replace 11 starters so the line up isn't as talented as last year, but they have "a tremendous amount of character and everything they get they will deserve," says Coach Sergeant.

From the Archives – 67 years ago

In June of 1942, the club approved the membership of Frederick S. Mendel who, in 1939, had left Europe with his family, fleeing the Nazi menace, and leaving behind a large meat packing empire and a considerable fortune. In 1940 Mendel arrived in Saskatoon and opened a new meat processing business on 11th Street West, naming it Intercontinental Packers and, by the time of his induction into the Rotary Club of Saskatoon, was already established as both a successful local businessman and one of the City's larger employers.

The club's archives also note that, in December of 1942, Fred Mendel graciously hosted a special meeting of the Club's Board of Directors at his home, where 'an excellent dinner was served'.

International Peace Garden 9/11 Memorial Project

Rotary Districts 5550 and 5580 are currently working to raise \$50,000 by the end of 2009 to complete the 9/11 Memorial Project at the International Peace Garden. This project began in May 2002 when the Province of Manitoba initiated the construction of a memorial at the International Peace Garden.

Soon after September 2001, Manitoba received 10 sections of girders that were part of the World Trade Centre and had them transported to the Garden. A temporary memorial site was constructed with a listing of the victims and their country of origin displayed in the Peace Chapel. This site remains temporary today.

In August 2006 the idea of Rotary becoming involved and assisting in the development of a permanent memorial site was suggested by the District Governor at the time, Rick Felstead. The location and internationality of the Peace Garden, what it stands for and how this relates to Rotary's ideals of World Peace and Understanding was seen as an excellent fit for Rotary involvement.

Our district (5550) then enlisted the support of our adjacent Rotary District in North Dakota, District 5580. Both districts agreed to raise funds as a joint international project. A design for the permanent memorial was developed. The cost for completion of the project is estimated at approximately \$150,000. To date \$100,000 in government funding has been secured. The two Districts are now in the process of raising the remaining \$50,000 by the end of 2009.

The project construction will begin in September and be completed for an official opening at a memorial service on 11 September 2010. Next year is also a significant milestone in Rotary history -it's the 100th anniversary of the year Rotary became international with the formation of the Rotary Club of Winnipeg.
