Program September 28, 2009 by Joy Adams Bauer

President Bernie introduced **Monica Drake** who defines herself as a "global nomad." She is a communications professional who has lived and worked in seven countries on 3 continents. She spent seven years with the World Bank in Washington.

Monica spoke about "Demystifying the World Bank". She describes the World Bank as a hybrid of a credit co-op and a corporate entity. Sovereign governments are shareholders of the Bank. When the Bank was established in 1944, it had 50 members, including Canada. There are 186 members today. 100 plus members are borrowers. Monica also explained that the World Bank is **not** the International Monetary Fund, not a charity and not an agency of the United Nations. It does not provide government grants like the Canadian International Development Agency. It exists to obtain and transfer funds as loans to borrowing members for specific programs. There are 10,000 staff, 30% of whom work outside the head office in Washington D.C. Over 120 different nationalities are represented in the Bank's workforce.

In the later part of 1928, the club recognized the bravery of Mary Ann Kirkness, the daughter of Hudson's Bay trapper at Split Lake, Manitoba, by sending a cheque for \$40 to be used for her education. Mary Ann, single handedly, saved the lives of several children by rescuing them from a burning building.
