# Program April 26, 2010

I apologize to all in advance for spelling mistakes!

Arlene spoke to us all about her recent visit to the village of Usonga in Tanzania. The funding for this project is through our Club and through a community organization in Humboldt. Arlene has always wanted to help the poor in Africa and that opportunity arose once she got out of politics. While this might sound like a lofty goal, Arlene indicated one you get there, it is easy as the condition are dire.

Arlene works as a nurse and sees a lot of issues arising from the conditions of kids living in close quarters. She is working with Norman Dewer to help with the education and living conditions of a number of people. The budget for medicare is approximately \$9000 which is extremely low.

Arlene helps in her role as a Doulah - helping women with labour. Natural childbirth is the way that birthing happens. We heard that many women are afraid of the process, there are HIV concerns (long labours, breastfeeding issues, infections), many of the women are you and generally the fear is quite high and the women need comforting and Arlen provides that comfort.

Many women would come to the Village of Usonga, either by bike or by walking to the village, if their husbands will allow it. Many have to travel many miles. For those who travel on the roads, the potholes are worse than anything we can imagine in Saskatoon. For those with complications, it is a 2 hour drive on these roads to the nearest hospital. Arlene told us of a lady that she offered to assist in paying for the gas to get her to the hospital but the husband denied this assistance and off she went into the dark night on her bicycle.

Arlene told us of making that journey with a 14-year-old girl and how excruciating that journey was. We heard of a lady delivering in a ditch on the roadside because he husband would not let her go in to the hospital. Maternal health is obviously at risk and the death rate is 1 in 5 kids die before the age of 5.

We heard of the troubling practice of "witch doctors" that are seeking albino children because they believe these children have good luck ability from their body parts. These children are snatched and killed for their body parts to be cut off as trophies and good luck charms. A Mother Theresa orphanage has opened its doors to albino children to protect them from this practice.

Education is key and more education needs to be taking place over there. Arlene would like to go back with \$30,000 to assist with a new pharmacy and to educate on health, nutrition, sex education - all things that can lead to changing attitudes.

Arlene addressed questions about the language barrier, Rotary clubs in Tanzania and HIV passing from the mothers to the babies.

Arlene will be putting together a power-point presentation in the next short while as a picture is worth a thousand words. Thank you Arlene for a powerful and thought provoking presentation.
