Program May 31, 2010 by Joy Adams Bauer

Member Graham Pearson presented on "Bankruptcy 101".

His opening slide was entitled: Bankruptcy 101 - The Rotary Club of Saskatoon One "wag" at your Editor's table noted the incongruous nature of the title!

Graham began by noting that Canada's bankruptcy laws are governed by the federal government. We have a much better system than south of the border. In order to declare bankruptcy you must have \$1,000 in assets. All debts are erased with the exception of child and spousal support, court fines, fraud charges, and student loans.

Graham also peppered his remarks with tidbits from "Graham's secret life". Did you know he:

- has sent two crooked bank managers to jail
- has hired strippers
- has poured a \$600,000 gold brick
- grew up in California and raced motorcycles
- is Past President of the Vancouver Rotary Club

Graham ended his presentation by giving President Bernie a \$700 cheque which makes him a Paul Harris Fellow. Thank you Graham for your generosity and belief in Rotary!

Our second presentation was by member Kevin Wilson on the Rotary Foundation

The Rotary Foundation shares a birthday with our club, as it was also founded in 1917. Arch Klumph began the Foundation with the grand sum of \$26.50. The Foundation's role was/is to "do good in the world." By 1928 Foundation funds had grown to \$5,000. In 1930 it made its first grant to the International Society for Crippled Children, which is now known as Easter Seals. After Paul Harris died in 1947, contributions began pouring in and the Paul Harris Memorial Fund was created to build the Foundation. By the beginning of the 21st century, annual contributions reached almost \$100 million **per year!!!** Current assets now exceed \$1 billion.

The Foundation supports programs including Ambassadorial Scholarships; Group Study Exchange; Health, Hunger and Humanity Grants; Rotary volunteers; PolioPlus; Grants for university teachers; and peace and conflict studies.

Every dollar donated to the Foundation is not used for 3 years, but invested, to cover costs. The recognized expert in the district on the Foundation is **Wayne Claypool** of the Meewasin Club. He'd be happy to speak with any member who is interested in more information.
