	PRESENTATION by Trevor Forrest, Executive Director, Saskatoon Community Foundation
	The Community Foundation is a charitable foundation that uses donations received to create ongoing endowments by keeping the principle in place and grant the income from the donations to Saskatoon charities. They will assist in charities of all aspects. There are 700 different charities in Saskatoon, they can contribute to any number of them in any one year. their mission is to 'Make Saskatoon the best community in which to live'. The foundation started in 1970 with their first grant of \$600 offered in 1971.
	In 2010 they hit a couple of milestones, they received thier largest gift ever of \$3 Million dollars from Vern & Claire Welker and they distributed \$1 Million dollars in grants.
	For smaller charities they can act as a conduit for people to donate shares in kind to them without having to set up thier own brokerage accounts to accept the gift. They will also set up legacy funds as per each donators cause they want to support.

The investments are managed out of Regina by Greystone Management. The Foundation has a staff of 4 and annual costs of operations are approximately 1.5% of the Endowment size.

They believe money CAN buy happiness.
