Rotary Youth Exchange Presentation

Peter Shiel introduced **Julia Ohrankammen** who is one of three Rotary Youth Exchange students currently spending their exchange year in Saskatoon. Julia is 17 years old and is attending Grade 12 at Bethlehem Catholic High School. She lives with her parents and sister in Finland's capital, Helsinki. Her mother is a translator who also spent a year on a Rotary Youth Exchange. Her father is a bank director and a Rotarian.

Finland has a population of 5.4 million people, with one million living in Helsinki. The country has two official languages and students take English, Swedish, and Finish at school. Finland is the most sparsely populated country in Europe. Much of it is covered by forest and it boasts many beautiful lakes and rivers. Military service is compulsory for males aged 18 to 60. University is free!

Some of Julia's favourite activities include horseback riding, playing the cello, basketball and running. She is currently playing the cello in the Saskatoon Youth Orchestra. She is living with her third host family, **Tim** and **Laura Cholowski**.

Julia gave a very interesting overview of her country including descriptions of Finnish food, architecture, natural beauty and the famous Finnish sauna. She is having the time of her life on her exchange and is lucky enough to be visiting other parts of western Canada with her host families. She ended her presentation by thanking Rotary for the opportunity we have given her.
