Community Legal Assistance Services for Saskatoon Inner City Inc. (CLASSIC)

Gary Rusu introduced Glen Luther who is a professor in the College of Law at the University of Saskatchewan. Glen has been a Crown attorney, defence lawyer, and has successfully argued a case in front of the Supreme Court of Canada. Glen's father was a member of our Rotary club in the 1950s.

Glen has been involved with CLASSIC since its inception four years ago. The clinic was established by law students and was located in the White Buffalo Youth Lodge on 20th Street for its first four years. It has just moved to its own location on 20th Street and Idywlyld Drive (123 20th Street West). CLASSIC provides an excellent experiential learning experience for the students and is a way for the College of Law to give back to the community. It's a way to create a generation of students who see the importance of volunteering in their community to make it a better place. The clinic is run by a volunteer Board of Directors with community representation. Services include:

- A walk in advocacy clinic dealing with issues of poverty law, residential tenancies, WCB, social assistance appeals, labour standards, and immigration and refugee cases. Two staff lawyers supervise the students. The clinic has an average of 225 open files at any one time. Sometimes they have to turn clients away. The 80 volunteers are very busy with an average of 50 new cases a week.
- A legal advice clinic staffed by lawyers who provide a 30 minute free consultation.
 19 lawyers in private practice donate their time.

Daul Varaa has volunteered at CLASSIC while studying for his law degree He will

convocate in June. Congratulations Paul!
