Molecular Resonance Coupling

Gary Rusu introduced **Robert Fisher** whose company Leaf & Stone has been providing molecular resonance coupling to the mining sector for the past number of years. Robert did a wonderful job of describing a complex subject in terms that everyone could understand and elicited quite a bit of interest from our Adventures in Technology guests.

Leaf & Stone is currently working on projects in Australia, Cambodia, and Africa. They purchased the technology they use from NASA and only really understand 4 to 7% of what molecular resonance coupling is capable of. Primarily they use the technology to see through rock 8500 feet below the surface. They primarily identify deposits of copper, silver, gold, kimberlite/diamonds and oil and gas. The majority of their clients are oil and gas companies and mining companies.

Robert showed some fascinating photographs of gold identified in Red Lake, Ontario (2700 feet under the ground). He also spoke about the largest potential diamond mine in the world at Fort a La Corne, Saskatchewan.

Interestingly enough, about 80% of the geologists in our province are still sceptical about the technology.
