Julia Ohrankammen - Rotary Youth Exchange Student

This is Julia's last meeting as she heads home to Finland at the end of the month. "Thank you Rotary for this opportunity," said Julia. "I have learned so much about myself and I have had wonderful host families while in Saskatoon." Julia presented a banner from her home club in Finland to **President Wayne McGillivary.**

Brad Harasymchuk - Ambassadorial Scholar

Peter Zakreski introduced Brad Harasymchuk, who has been studying for the past eleven months as a Rotary ambassadorial scholar at the University of Canterbury in Christchurch, New Zealand. Brad is a teacher at St. Paul's Roman Catholic Separate School Division in Saskatoon in the Opening Doors program.

Brad gave an overview of life in Christchurch, a city of 375,000. Due to the recent earthquakes in Christchurch, about 100,000 people have left the city and its population is now about 275,000. Tourism and rugby are the big draws for the city. Brad and his wife experienced two of the earthquakes. Fortunately there was no damage to their home, which is built on stable ground, as opposed to marsh, where the majority of homes in Christchurch are built. There have been 6500 aftershocks since September 2010 in the Canterbury region alone.

Brad is studying at the School of Maori, Social and Cultural Studies in Education. He is researching alternative education programs in Saskatoon and Christchurch and working with indigenous and non-indigenous youth.

He has participated in a number of service projects whilst in New Zealand including the Student Army (started by a student at the University of Canterbury as a response to the earthquakes). The Student Army is 25,000 people strong helping with the cleanup of the city. He has also delivered food boxes with Rotary and the Salvation Army.

The Ambassadorial Scholarship has been a "life-changing experience". Thank you to Rotary for making it possible.

Peter Whitenect introduced Rotarian Bryan Tastad who has agreed to chair the communications subcommittee for RAP.
