The transformation of health care - integrative medicine

Peter Zakreski introduced Deedee Maltman who gave an inspirational and very high energy presentation. Deedee has been what she terms a "traditional/conventional" physician for 26 years. She decided she wanted to try something new especially to help combat high levels of obesity and cardiovascular disease in our society.

She spent time at the world famous Canyon Ranch in Arizona to begin her journey. She is now taking Dr. Weil's online integrative medicine program through Tuscon University. Integrative medicine is healing oriented medicine that takes into account the whole person (body, mind, spirit), including all aspects of lifestyle. It uses a therapeutic relationship and makes use of all appropriate therapies, both conventional and alternative. Integrative medicine integrates all of the health sciences disciplines and creates a team approach between nurses, physiotherapists, physicians, pharmacists - all members of the health care team. The new Academic Health Sciences building currently being built on campus will lend itself to this integrated way of learning.

Deedee noted that statistically, cardiovascular health is the area where she can make the most difference. According to statistics, lifestyle changes and choices can lead to a 72% reduction in the risk of cardiovascular disease. Help from the medical profession can only lead to a 38% reduction!!

Integrative medicine will lead to a reduction in health care costs and move us away from the "sickness" model to the "wellness" model.

James graduated from the U of S with a management degree specializing in marketing and human resources. He is planning to apply for the MBA program at the U of S.
