An overview of the Provincial Court of Saskatchewan

Peter Zakreski introduced Judge Carol Schnell who gave a extremely interesting presentation about the provincial court. Judge Schnell was the first woman appointed as a Chief Judge of the Provincial Court in 2008. She had served as a judge since 1999 and spent many years as a Crown Prosecutor prior to being appointed to the provincial bench.

Judge Schnell explained that 49 judges sit in 13 permanent provincial court locations throughout the province. 12 judges in Saskatoon; 10 in Regina; and 6 in Prince Albert. There are also 66 circuit points, with 15 of those being fly-in locations. 98% of the criminal work in the province is handled by provincial court. Queen's Bench Court handles family law matters, with the exception of child protection cases.

Judge Schnell commented on the changes in law since she began practicing 35 years ago. In the 1980s, society became conscious of the over-representation of Aboriginal people in the justice system. They decided the traditional "punitive" approach was not working. Restorative Justice started with sentencing circles in the north. The provincial court is very much in favour of restorative justice initiatives. Judge Schnell applauded our club for its restorative action program.

The province now has domestic violence courts in Regina, North Battleford and Saskatoon, which encourage offenders to acknowledge responsibility for their crimes and get into treatment right away. With continual court supervision, these types of sentences have been very successful due to their true rehabilitative effect.

Regina has a drug treatment court thanks to funding from the federal government.

Members had many questions for Judge Schnell who answered each question thoroughly and thoughtfully.
