HOPE for Malawi

Elaine Zakreski (with the help of her trusty assistant **Peter**), began her presentation by thanking all the Rotarians who have supported HOPE for Malawi **Peter** reported that \$250,000 has been raised over the past three years!

Elaine's first photograph was of a beautiful sunset over the Rift Valley in the Domasi region of Malawi. She provided a very thorough update on all that has happened with this project over the past year. Did you know that HOPE for Malawi has grown from its initial 14 villages to 40!

Elaine and Peter shared photos of a memorial service for one of the village chiefs they had worked with in the past (a chief who had laid a lot of groundwork for co-operation amongst his people); the medical clinic; the medicine donated by the Mennonite Central Committee; a maize mill; 11 bore holes; the tuck shop; the school (the plan is to build four more schools) and students and teachers; medical staff; happy children playing with soccer balls; donated school supplies and cloth being made into clothing; and pens with healthy looking cattle.

The Ministry of Health for the Zomba Central Region is now a partner in the project.

"We don't do things for people, they do them for themselves and we partner with them," explained Elaine. The project has been "a journey in human relationships." Hard work has been done to get the 40 village chiefs working together. "When you come back, we will be united," said one chief to Elaine.

The presentation ended with a photo of Elaine with her "sister" Jean Kalinga who is doing such good work helping the villagers to manage their resources. And a final shot of a sunset over the Rift Valley.
