Guest Speaker

The Art Gallery of Saskatchewan

Peter Zakreski introduced Vincent Varga, Executive Director of the Mendel Art Gallery. Mr. Varga began his presentation with a history lesson explaining that the Saskatoon Arts Centre began in the 1930's in the basement of the King George Hotel. The Arts Centre opened in its present location in 1964 with funding from the province, the City of Saskatoon and the Fred Mendel family.

The city took over operation of the Art Gallery in 1967 and renamed it the Mendel Art Gallery. Fred Mendel donated the gallery's first 13 works of art. The gallery now houses 7,000 pieces of art worth \$14 million. The Mendel Art Gallery is well-loved by Saskatonians with 181,000 visitors last year.

In 2008 the Government of Canada provided funding for a new art gallery and land became available at River Landing. KPMB Architects of Toronto won the bid to design the new building. Mr. Varga showed the floor plans of the new gallery and the architect's drawings. A space within the gallery will be dedicated to Fred Mendel and will showcase the 13 works of art he donated. The Perehudoff murals, which have been painstakingly restored from their home at the former Intercontinental Packers plant, will be displayed in the same space. The new Art Gallery of Saskatchewan is funded by the City of Saskaton (\$21 million), the Government of Saskatchewan (\$17 million), a capital campaign (\$20 million) and a very generous donation of \$30 million by local philanthropist Ellen Remai.

Vincent ended his presentation by suggesting how we can help write the next chapter of Saskatoon's history by being advocates for the new gallery which is scheduled to open in the spring of 2015.
