Guest Speaker - French District 1520 Rotary Exchange Student Gauthier Mace

In addition to sharing interesting information about Rotary club, Gauthier spoke about the highlights of the Rotary Exchange Student Program, of which our Club has been a long term participant and supporter. His High School and his current Hosts are Marcel and Alison De La Gorgendiere (652-6501).

About Youth Exchange



Rotary Youth Exchange students spend up to a year living with host families and attending school in a different country.

Students who participate in Rotary's long-term or short-term Youth Exchange programs, learn a new way of living, a great deal about themselves, and maybe even become ambassadors, teaching people they meet about their country, culture, and ideas. They can help bring the world closer – and make some good friends in the process.

For over 75 years, students and host families have broadened their horizons through Rotary Youth Exchange. More than 80 countries and over 8,000 students participate in the program, which is administered at the regional level by Rotary districts and at the local level by Rotary clubs.

Rotary Youth Exchange is open to young people ages 15-25 worldwide. There are two basic types of exchanges: short-term and long-term.

Short-term exchange

General short-term exchange

- Ages 15-19
- Several days to several weeks long
- Don't involve attending high school, but students can tailor their experience to match their interests
- Can include homestays, tours, and international youth camps

New Generations Exchange

- Ages 18-25
- Three weeks to three months
- Ideal for recent secondary school graduates
- Can include homestays, tours, camps, or specialized internships

Long-term exchange

- Ages 15-19
- One year
- Involves living with a few host families and attending a local school
