# RAP


As previously noted the Club's RAP program has now been sited by the Provincial Government of RAP as an important element in its newly announced anti bullying program.



Scott and his twin brother Jack are 15 years old and attend Centennial High in Grade 10. They both participated this year in the RYLA Camp (Rotary Youth Leadership Awards ) held this year at Riding Mountain National Park

RYLA is a leadership development program run by Rotary. While participants can be any age, most events focus on secondary school students, university students, or young professionals. RYLA events are typically 3–10 days long and include presentations, activities, and workshops that cover a variety of topics, including:

- Leadership fundamentals and ethics
- · Communication skills
- Problem solving and conflict management
- Community and global citizenship

Jack and Scott shared a slide show portraying the team building and leadership development activities covered over the five days of the camp. Participants came from all over the district. The attendance this year was another full house at 57 participants, indicating that RYLA is in a healthy state in Saskatchewan.

Rotary exchange stydents shared their experiences at the camp and unique activities included team building and goal setting skills of "101 goals in 1001 days".

When asked the important lessons learned, the boys replied that they learned about themselves, diversity and how to work under pressure. One of them even gained a girlfriend!!

# **Bethany Home**

Bethany Home is a transitional program for girls ages 13 – 18 years who are at risk in their own homes or in the community and are referred to Bethany by their Family Service Worker. The girls can stay for a period of 3 or 4 months while their worker creates a plan for them to return home or move on to a long term program. They may come to the home with addictions to drugs or alcohol, or have been abused sexually or physically and they are often experiencing difficulty in school and may have been involved in illegal activities. Some are connected to gangs or being targeted by gangs. At the Home they have the opportunity to learn to make healthy choices and how to deal with conflict / crisis situations.

The girls are expected to participate in school while they reside at Bethany Home or a program of equal value and they are encouraged to be involved in extracurricular activities such as soccer, dance, music etc. Spiritual Care Programming and Art Therapy are provided twice a week and we always make every effort to address cultural needs of the residents of the home.

# **Mumford House**

As the need for help in our community has grown, so has the need for shelter beds for women and children. Mumford House is a 36 bed shelter for women and their children who need a safe place to call home while they look for safe and sustainable longer term housing. The staff are able to assist with finding funding and housing resources and other personal needs such as clothing, personal hygiene items etc.
