Program

Jim Engdahl, MAS Gold Corp CEO and Director, provided members with information on gold exploration in the La Ronge Gold Belt.

Jim is a Saskatchewan native and has spent the past 50 years raising money for Saskatchewan projects.

Jim is a former Vice President of Barclays Bank of Canada. He has been involved in leadership of different public companies, including Pacific & Western Trust, Shore Gold Inc., Claude Resources Inc. He was also the Regional Advisory Partner of the corporate finance arm of one of Western Canada's largest accounting firms. This position came as a result of the accounting firm's purchase of Cascadia Ventures Inc., a corporate financing and consulting group responsible for raising project financing in excess of \$100 million of which he was Managing Partner.

He is also a former President, CEO & Director of Great Western Mineral Group Ltd. ("GWMG") as well as a former Director for Great Western Diamonds ("GWD"), both are publicly traded companies listed on the TSX. During his tenure, the companies were involved in advanced development of a Rare Earth deposit as well as exploration of a diamond bearing kimberlitic deposit in Saskatchewan. Subsequently GWD was sold in 2009 so the company could maintain focus on building one of the world's premiere Rare Earth companies. During his 7 years at GWMG Jim was responsible for raising over \$150,000,000 for the company as well as acquiring one of the highest-grade Rare Earth mines in the world via a creeping takeover. During this time, he was also responsible for the acquisition of one of the only Rare Earth alloy plants outside of China providing key magnet alloys to most of the Rare Earth magnet users of the world

Ron Netelitzky, a mining guru, invited Jim to join MAS Gold to help them over a few milestones.

MAS Gold Corp. - TSXV-MAS - is focused on exploration projects in Saskatchewan along the La Ronge Greenstone Belt. These road accessible projects are located approximately 60 km west of producing Seabee and Santoy gold mines operated by SSR Mining Inc.

In the belt, MAS Gold Corp. operates the Greywacke and Preview North Properties that include North Lake and Point advanced gold projects, each hosting drill-intercepted zones of gold mineralization.

With addition of the Elizabeth Lake VMS deposit and Henry Lake, MAS has a 100% ownership of four properties totaling 33, 843 hectares (83, 628 acres) along geologically prospective sections of La Ronge, Kiskeynew and Glennie Domains of the La Ronge Gold Belt.

The Greywacke North deposit, which hosts several known stratabound, high-grade gold-bearing zones, has 255,500 tonnes at 9.92 g/t Au (cut-off grade of 5 grams gold/tonne) plus an Inferred Mineral Resource of 59,130 tonnes at 7.42 g/t Au (NI 43-101 Technical Report, June 1, 2016).

The North Lake deposit located at Preview North Property is estimated to contain an Inferred Mineral Resource of 14,110,000 t grading 0.92 g/t Au, hence 417,000 contained ounces of gold. (NI 43-101 Technical Report, April 10, 2020)

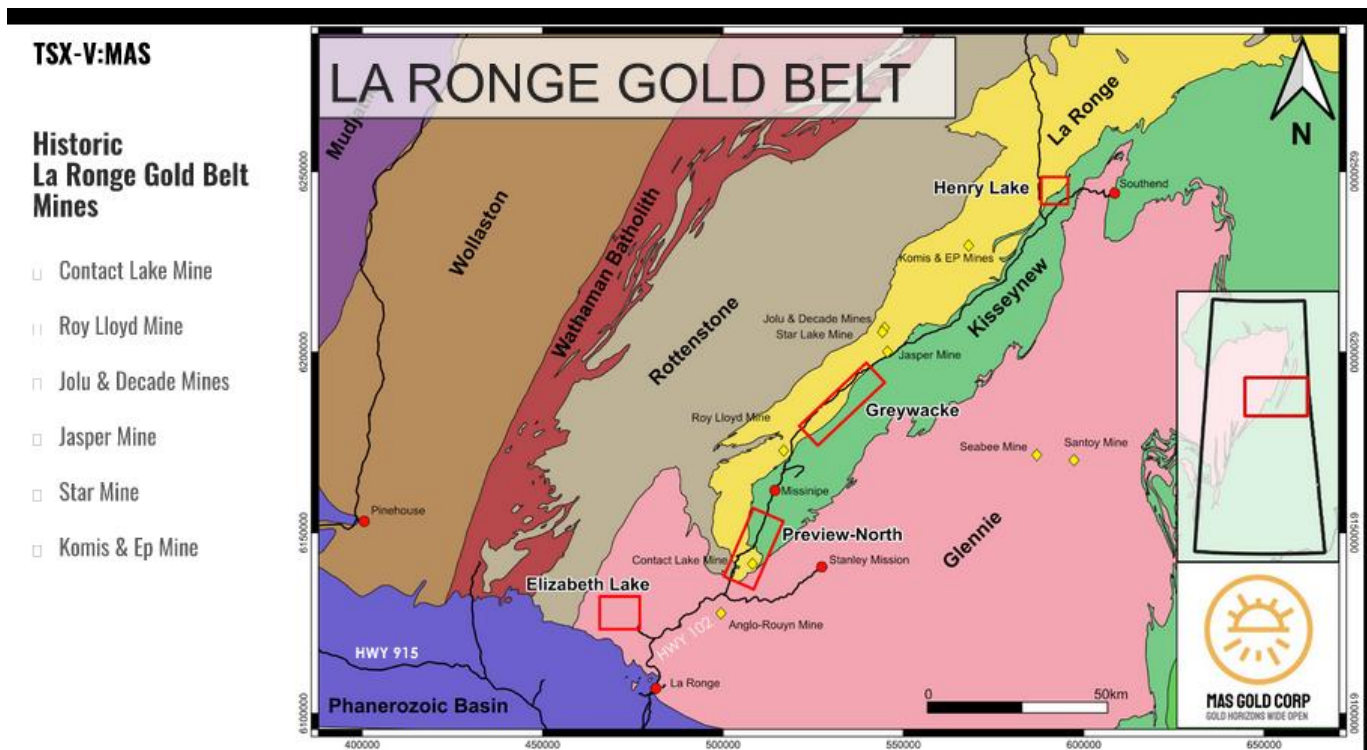
MAS Gold has recently completed a more intensive phase of work directed towards establishing the resource base for its “hub and spoke” mining model for its Preview-North and Greywacke projects. On top of that, MAS has recently entered into an agreement with the government of Saskatchewan to acquire a 100% interest in approximately 463 hectares, including the former producing Contact Lake Gold Mine operated from 1994 to 1997.

The Contact Lake Property is located approximately 57 kilometres north of the town of La Ronge on Provincial Highway 102 and 6 kilometres east of the highway (see Figure 1). Upon completion of the transaction, MAS Gold will hold mineral rights to roughly 34,306 hectares (84,771 acres) spread along the full trend of the La Ronge Gold Belt.

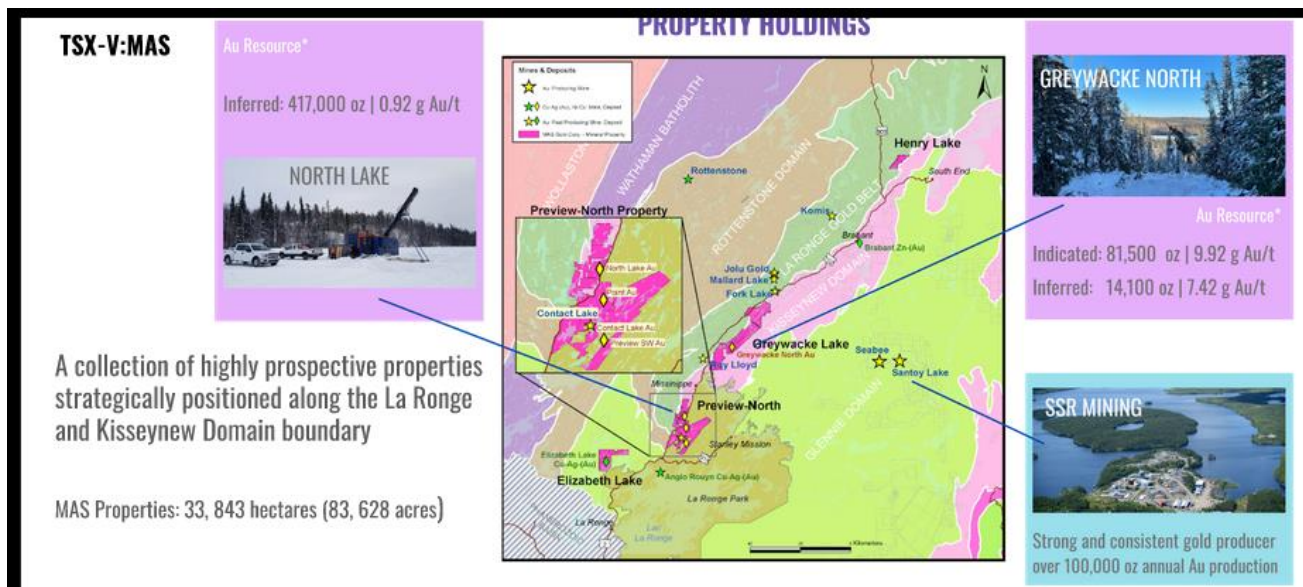
The Corporate vision is to develop over one million ounces of gold resources, by upgrading and considering established resources from our portfolio of properties located in the La Ronge gold belt.

Saskatchewan is now the #1 jurisdiction in the world for mineral exploration and mining.

Over time, there were 7 gold mines. Only one has survived. It has mined out over 1.5 million ounces of gold. It was a narrow vein of high-grade gold. Many weren't economical at \$300 gold. The gold is to gain control of the gold in this area.



They own two key properties – the Grewacke and North Lake properties – which have about 750,000 ounces of gold reserves. Grewacke is a low grade ore which is open pit mined.



Their model is the Hub and Spoke Mode. The hope to purchase an existing mill, which would be the centre of the spoke.

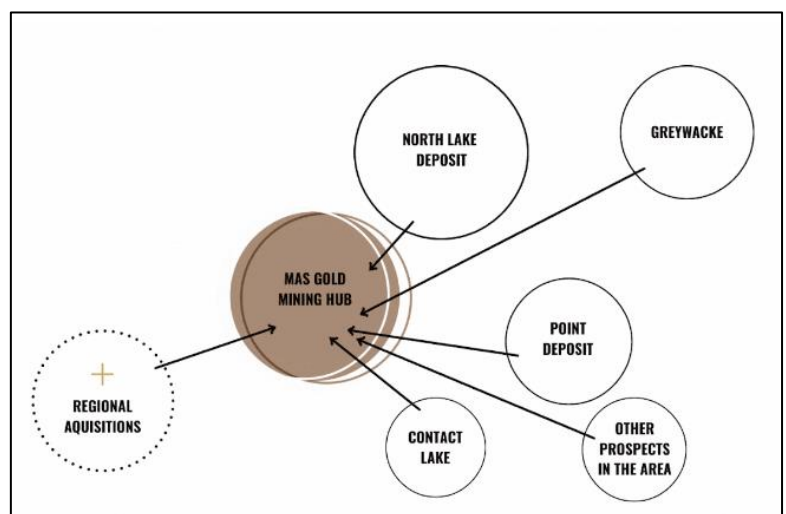
HUB AND SPOKE MINING CONCEPT

MAS Gold’s current vision is to pursue a hub and spoke mining and processing business model.

The concept is based on the idea that the mineralized material from various satellite deposits would be co-mingled at a centrally located facility, (most likely positioned around North Lake) creating an opportunity for an efficient operation.

The highly positive preliminary [metallurgy testing outcomes](#) have been supportive of the concept.

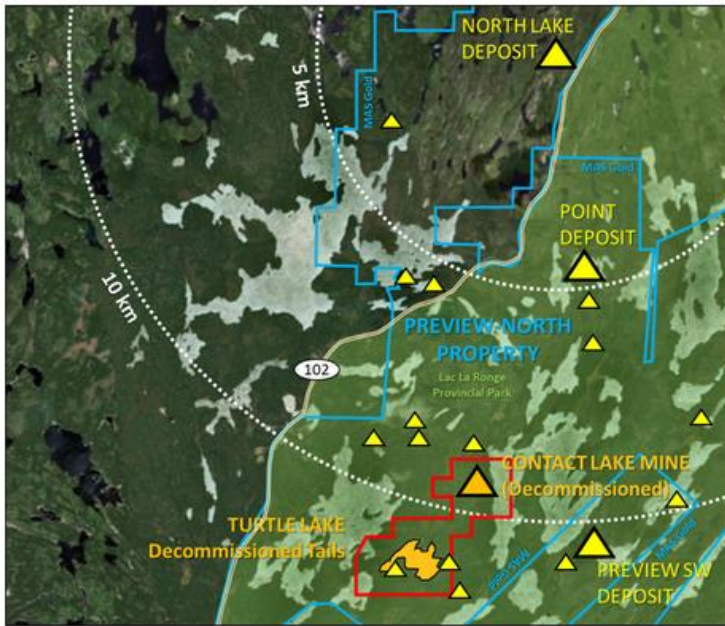
Preview North is where the activity is now. The have been doing several drilling projects. The grade seems to be better as they drill deeper.



There is only Gold in these deposits. The rare earths are associated with the uranium.

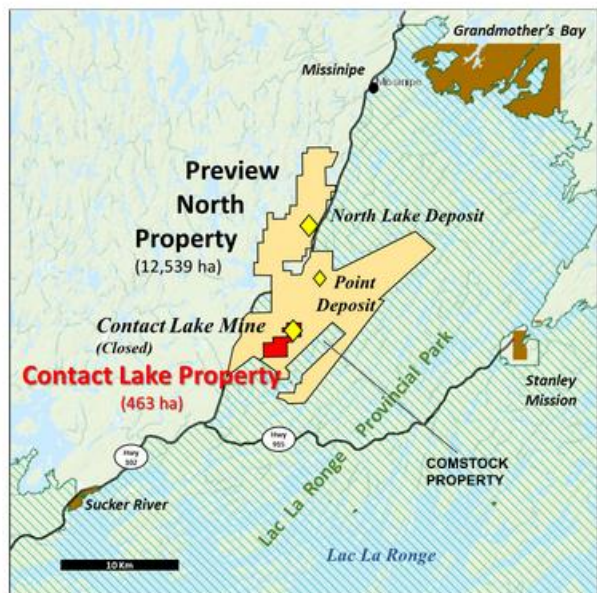
