

Program

Les introduced our speaker, Bill Henley, from the Bridge City Bicycle Co-op.



The Bridge City Bicycle Co-op (BCBC) is a volunteer-run, non-profit cooperative that offers a drop-in workspace, tools and supplies, and participatory bicycle maintenance education; where youth and adults of all ages can come and learn how to fix their own bicycles or build a bicycle using donated frames and parts.

Bill shared several slides with us, explaining the great work the co-op has done now for several years. (started in 2012)

Adult and children membership is now Free. Every child under 18 is entitled to 1 free bike per year. Adult bikes are pay-what-you can.

They have several programs – one called Bike Diversion.

This is how it works:

- Self-haulers drop off bikes at the Material Recovery Centre at the Saskatoon Regional Waste Management Centre.
- BCBC volunteers triage and organize the bikes at the Landfill on Sunday shifts as required.
- Usable bikes/parts are brought back to the BCBC by volunteers.
- Desirable bikes are fixed at the shop and distributed back into the community.

As an example, in 2022-23 261 bikes were diverted, 167 harvested (given away) and 78 bikes scrapped. The co-op is volunteer driven and as such are always looking for volunteers...training sessions are on Sundays on wheels, brakes, shifting and bearings.
