





PROGRAM

Peter Peters was invited to introduce our guest speaker, Rotarian Sam Berg, an appreciated member of Regina Eastview. Peter noted that Sam is a Saskatchewanian, who was raised on a farm in the Yorkton Area; has an Undergraduate Degree from the University of Wisconsin, Master of Divinity from Sioux Falls Seminary and a Doctor of Ministry from Palmer Seminary in Philadelphia. He served as a pastor in churches

in Kelowna, Ottawa and Regina and in 1995 was appointed to the Briercrest faculty where he coordinated the marriage and family counselling program. In 1996 he received a part-time counselling appointment at The Caring Place, a role in which he continues to participate. Sam is married to Erica, they have 2 children and 3 grandchildren. Sam's task was to tell us about The Caring Place.

From Sam we learned:

GUIDANCE ASSISTANCE

- The Caring Place is "...a safe and professional non-profit counselling centre where people of all ages, from young children to older adults, can find a caring professional to help them deal successfully with personal issues regardless of their ability to pay.";
- This "Faith Based" organization opened its doors in 1991 and he joined the faculty in 1996;
- Counsellors at The Caring Place "...respect each client's values, religion, race, and gender";
- Being "Faith Based" means the organization and the staff are committed to a specific set of defined values
 - values of which all are aware and staff are intentional in how these values effect their work;
 - Personal values are key as in their absence we can get caught up in the values of the culture around us;
 - Counsellors are required to have a Master Degree, together with a recognized complimentary internship;
 - They serve a broad range of clients from children to seniors, and have the expertise to assist in dealing with most any issue;
 - Their most recent venture is the establishment of a "walk in" clinic;
- While there are a number of agencies in Regina that provide similar services, there is no formal coordination of the services offered;
- The Caring Place is funded by the fees paid by clients; some clients are registered with "employee assistance" programs; and, donations. There is no Government Funding for "faith based" organizations;
- Sam summed up the work undertaken by The Caring Place in the words of a former client who suggested, "You help people discover there is life after life".



PR Greg thanked Sam for his wonderful presentation and commended Sam for the critical role The Caring Place plays in the lives of their clients.
