NEW MEMBER INDUCTION

PROGRAM



President Richard introduced the Program, which was the Finance Duo of Jizinge Mwela and Doreen Pankewich, who will present. for the membership's consideration, the 2017-2018 Budget.

In introducing the process, Treasurer Jizinge noted that Clarence Krause is the third person in the Finance team and is responsible for posting "keeping the

books". Jizinge reviewed the Balance Sheet and Doreen reviewed the current

year's income and expenditure statements and how these impacted preparation of the 2017-2018 Budget. Doreen made the following observations in her discussion:

i. Board of Directors choose to transfer \$5,000.00 per annum out of the accumulated surplus into the Clubs operating budget to offset the option of increasing membership fees;



- ii. Board has also decided to move up to 10% of funds raised through our various fund raising initiatives to offset operational expenses;
- iii. In response a question raised, a portion of surpluses identified during the year will be directed toward educational opportunities for members to attend events such as District Assemblies;
- iv. At this point Project Funds have been divided equally among the three Project areas Community Projects; International Projects; and, Youth Projects. Responsibility for the "finer" reshuffling of these resources will be left to Director Jack Wozniak and the three Project area.
