
We were welcomed with the gonging of the bell by **President Ron Okumura**, who immediately called on Nelson Falkowsky to lead is in the singing of our National Anthem.

PROGRAM

President Ron advised the program presenter today did not need an introduction and so the man did not receive the customary intro because our speaker was Ron Okumura. Ron presentation related to the Stop Hunger Now initiative. Stop Hunger Now is an international hunger relief program committed to ending hunger. Their Website says: "Stop Hunger Now gets food and life-saying aid to the world's most vulnerable people, and works to end



global hunger in our lifetime. Established in 1998, we have provided over 225 million meals in 73 countries. We are based **STOP HUNGER NOW.** in Raleigh, N.C., and operate through affiliates in developing countries." in Raleigh, N.C., and operate throughout the U.S. and through



When the Okumura's attended the Rotary International Convention in San Paulo, Brazil in the summer of 2015, Ron learned about and was impressed with this program which was featured at the convention.

Stop Hunger Now is a meal packaging program which started the packaging process in 2005. The Agency provides the packaging site with the dehydrated ingredients, all the packaging supplies and equipment and the necessary instructions. The Packaging site raises

the funds for materials (\$0.50 per meal prepare

50,000 meals), finds the venue, tables and volunteers.

Once packaged, the food is transported to depots for distribution to holding locations around the world. Locations receiving food includes school lunch programs in developing countries, orphanages, disaster sites and general feeding causes. At the feeding site the water is added to the dehydrated ingredients of the package, heated and the result is a nutritious meal.

At this point Regina Rotary Presidents' Counsel has identified a venue (Living Hope Alliance Church) and an interest by at least some of the Rotary Clubs in the City. In 2014, carefully managed administrative and fundraising costs, allowing us to invest 87.9% of expenses in our programs."
