

PROGRAM



Nelson was called on to introduce guest speaker Tracy Fahlman. Tracy is CEO of the Regina Hotel Association, a position she has held since 2009. She was born in Saskatchewan and is a long-time resident of Regina. She is a graduate of the University of Regina and has Academic credentials in Business Administration. The Regina Hotel Association is an organization that promotes Regina Hotels but also an advocate for the City of Regina as a great place to have conventions and special events.

In her opening remarks Tracy Fahlman referred to the Regina Hotel Association as the "Voice of Hotels" in the City, a City that has 3,000 hotel rooms and employs over 1,300 staff. One thousand hotel rooms have been

added in recent years, which has since 2006 seen the addition of almost one new hotel added each year. Tracy noted the opening of the Comfort Suites in northwest Regina in December 2015; a new Marriott Hotel on Pasqua Street will open shortly; as will the Sheraton Four Points Hotel on Dewdney; and the new hotel on the corner of Albert and Parliament, which is scheduled to open in December 2016.

Tracy reminded us that the Delta is now the Delta by Marriott; the City now boasts a Hilton presence with the opening of the Double Tree by Hilton Hotel & Conference Centre. Additionally the Saskatchewan Hotel, part of the Marriott group, has become part of the prestigious Autograph Collection



by *Marriott*, and is undergoing renovations which will include a significant renovation to their restaurant dining area.

The Regina Hotel Association focuses on three strategies: Sponsorship; Marketing; and, Capital Infrastructure. In regard to "Sponsorship", the Association looks to bringing 60 significant events to Regina over the course of a year. In the area of Marketing, the Association has developed powerful partnerships with Tourism Regina,



Events Regina and Convention Regina. They have collectively established a Creative Team which is responsible for packaging Regina in a manner that makes Regina competitive with the likes of Whistler and Niagara Falls. Using words like "Crown", "Royal", RCMP, etc. and reminding people they are and will be treated "royally" when they come to Regina, sets the City in a very special league. Thirdly, investing in capital infrastructure like the Little League ball park, and the "Finishing Line Facility on Wascana Lake, is a clear indication that the Association is an important corporate citizen.

Tracy concluded her presentation by playing a video advertising the Event of Events Competition which invites



applications on an "Event Dreams" you have for the City of Regina. This begins with an application and interviews which will lead finalists to present their "Event Dream" to a panel in a "Dragon's Den" format. The closing date for applications is February 26th. Having Tracy Fahlman advocating for Regina, has to make the citizens exceedingly proud of their City, and thankful for the leadership provide by this eloquent lady. Tip of the hat to Tracy Fahlman!
