



Greg is passionate about life. Greg came to the podium to discuss an opportunity for Rotary. He noted that he had been a Deputy Returning Officer in the recent Federal election and had a great time. There is an opportunity for Rotary to raise funds by assisting at the polls in the next provincial election. 10,000 workers are required for Election Day, April 4, 2016. Twenty Rotarians could work for \$180-

your election pay and receive your charitable receipt. This would be a non-partisan involvement. Greg will find out more information to some of the questions members had and return at a later date for further discussion. There was considerable interest among the members for this initiative. Thank you Greg, for bringing this opportunity to Eastview.

From the Saskatchewan Elections site, the responsibilities of a Deputy Returning Officer are: Set up, opening and closing of the polling station, process voters and issue ballots to eligible voters, maintain security of the ballot box and all ballots, administer oaths as required, supervise the voting process, conduct the ballot count after polls close, report results to RO or SDRO, complete appropriate records, maintain peace and order at the

Once a potential new member has completed an application for membership it will be forwarded to the Membership Committee. One or two Membership Committee members will arrange a short meeting with the prospective member to provide some details to them about Rotary e.g. attendance requirement, fees, the organizational structure of the Club and RI information. Following this process the application will be forwarded to the Board for approval. It is hoped that this will help the new Rotarian understand Club membership and enthuse them to become immersed in Eastview life.
