- Louis Browne, who was co-M.C of the Chinese New Year celebration last Saturday and got way ahead of schedule; he was rescued by Doug Archer who spoke off the cuff about Regina's Twin City, Jilin.
- Pat Richards, whose grandson is doing well at Notre Dame.
- Pat Dell and Jeanne Martinson also promoted Business and Professional Women which has several excellent programs coming up, including a presentation by Katherine Gagne.

**Program:** Rebecca Benko of the Canadian Red Cross introduced the Speaker, Luc Mullinder, a former Saskatchewan Roughrider, who was on the team which won the Grey Cup in 2007, and who retired at the end of the 2012 season He returned to Saskatchewan and worked for Harvard Broadcasting and now works as the Product Manager for the Canadian Red Cross.

Luc told us that the *Imagine No Bullying Initiative* now reaches one child in every 3 in the province, and by 2019 the project will have expanded to every student in Saskatchewan, which is leading Canada. Pink Day is a province-wide awareness campaign. Hand-picked Saskatchewan Roughriders are selected to undergo 2 days of intensive training, after which they go to schools where they give a 45-minute presentation. During the period from February to mid-May they will have contact with 30,000 students. The program has been gaining momentum since 2007, and 34 schools have signed up in the first week after registration opened. Students are then selected to undergo 2 days of intensive training to become Youth Facilitators, and then return to the schools to work with their peers. These mass training events are

coming up at the Univ. of Regina and the Univ. of Sask. Northern communities are asking for the program to be



started there, but this can be very expensive because of transport costs. One of the Saskatchewan Roughriders is up there right now. T-shirts, polo shirts and packs of 3 pairs of socks can be ordered and are fund-raisers. The Canadian Digital Network, (CDN), with 30,000 billboards across the province, has also become involved.

President Greg then called up Luc & Rebecca, thanked them and presented each with an insulated blue bag. Following are 3 links which provide more information on
