PROGRAM



Assistant Governor Lorne Crozon was called on to introduce our Guest Speaker District Governor Rod Riopel. From AG Lorne we learned our DG is in the Rotary Club of Kenora, his second Rotary Club having been introduced into Rotary in 1996 in Sudbury, Ontario, where he was a self-acclaimed "knife and forker". Kenora changed his image of Rotary, and it was here that Rotary filled a "service" outlet for which he was looking. Community involvement is an important aspect of his desired lifestyle. Having spent a portion of his career with Motorola, Rod is self-employed spending a portion of his time working out of a Winnipeg "office". Rod has two sons. He and Barb are planning their marriage in the summer of 2017.

Rod began his presentation commending President Greg and members of the Club's Executive for their dedication to Rotary and the initiatives undertaken locally and internationally. He shared his enthusiasm for Rotary and the strength and consistency of the sense of Fellowship that prevails in all levels of Rotary. This was made real



to Barb when they were at Rotary School in San Diego and she was embraced by the wife of the President of Rotary International (in the ladies washroom). It was in San Diego that he learned to appreciate the breadth of Rotary as he was one of 530 plus District Governors Elect who would be leading Rotary's 1.2 million members in the 35,000 Clubs in the world.

RI President Elect (at that time and President as of July 1, 2016) John Germ (**right John & Judy Germ**), choose as the theme for this year, *Rotary Serving Humanity*. The reason for this choice was based on the premise that he wanted Rotary to "get down to the basics" of Rotary – service to humanity. John Germ's RI predecessor from Sierra Lanka reminded the incoming group of District Governors that there is not another organization that can impact the world like Rotary, using his country as an example



where a civil war raging in a component of the country halted their fighting for three days so that Polio immunization could be carried out - a pause in war brokered by Rotary. There is no end to the good we can do because, "All the limits we have, we put on ourselves." So the key is to do the things we do best - Serve Humanity.



Rod spoke about the key to moving our clubs forward, is to start to share where we have been and where we want to go collectively. This means, unlike in past years where direction had the potential to change each year as a new president took the helm, successful clubs, now and in the future, are Clubs where is a multi-year plans are




developed and maintained to the benefit of all. In this process we must ask ourselves, "Why are we in Rotary", and "what is expected of me". Our need is for Rotarians with a purpose, determining the thing we want, defining how we can achieve our dream. Rotary had a dream – we wanted a Polio free world, after a time Bill Gates called the President of Rotary International and said, "I believe in what you are doing – I won't give you money but I will match what you raise up to \$100 million". And so began a partnership which is about changing the world.

DG Rod concluded his message by emphasizing RIP John Germs Goals: i) Membership attraction and engagement; ii) Foundation Giving; iii) Humanitarian Service in the local community and internationally; iv) Reflect a strong focus on new generations; and, v) Focus on Public Image.

President Greg thanked DG Rod for sharing his vision and providing the always welcomed inspiration. DG Rod and Barb were most pleased to receive their own personal handy-dandy shopping bag.
