

**Program**: Father Lorne Crozon (below left) came to the podium to introduce our guest speaker, DG Ken Krebs. Ken grew up in St. James which is now a suburb of Winnipeg. He joined the Royal Canadian Air Force after



high school and enjoyed the technical side of the F-104 fighter while stationed in Cold Lake, Alberta. After leaving the Air Force he attended United College, now the University of Winnipeg. He enjoyed the atmosphere

there and became the founding member of what is now the Technology Solutions Center at the University of Winnipeg.



He served on many University committees. Ken also served as scoutmaster for the First Crestview Scout Troup for twenty-five years and as an adult trainer with Scouts Canada for 23 years. In 2000 he and Donna moved to Gimli where he left the scouting movement and joined the Rotary Club of Gimli. He has



served in many roles at both the Club and District level. He feels strongly about Rotary's six areas of focus, but holds Polio Plus, Literacy and Peace close to his heart. Ken and Donna have been married nearly 50 years and have one son and three grandchildren.

The DG came to the podium and told us of a story relayed by the RI President Ravindran that demonstrates the power of giving. DG Ken reminded us that we have many gifts that we bring to Rotary—time, talent and knowledge. To succeed in the eradication of polio will be Rotary's greatest gift to the world. He also advised that we need to be ready to meet new challenges in the area of attracting new members and retaining current members. Membership in District 5550 decreased by 45 members in 2014-15. 

The meeting adjourned with members reciting the Rotary 4-Way Test.




