

#### **SERGEANT –AT-ARMS**



Congratulations, Sam.

By way of announcement Sergeant Pat advised the Annual Past Presidents Picnic will be held in Pat Dell's back yard (**247 Hasting Crescent, Regina**) on the afternoon of Sunday August 20<sup>th</sup>. There is no charge for Rotarians and members of their families to attend as the cost of the event is born by the Past Presidents.

### **PROGRAM**

President Richard called on Peter Peters to introduce our guest speaker, Keith Renaud. From Peter's introduction



we learned that Keith was born in Regina, but had the good fortune to live in many of the Canadian provinces. He returned to Regina in the late 1990's and it seems their "nomadic" life style came to an end. Keith, a letter carrier with Canada Post, has three children, a daughter and two sons. Keith was here today to tell us about the "Matthew Project" a program of *Victory Church* in Regina.

From Keith we learned that the Matthew Project is based on the Bible's New Testament, Gospel of Matthew scripture Chapter 25:35-40. The project started when two members of Regina's Victory Church, unknown to each other, choose to take water and food to the homeless people in Regina. This effort to develop a relationship

with persons who do not have a home is a challenge and not one for the faint hearted. Once Church leadership became aware of this activity, work was undertaken to amalgamate their individual effort and energy.

In response to Keith's question, two people in the room had experienced personal homelessness, for the rest of us it was an unknown. It is difficult to understand what, "home is where the heart is" means when one does not have a home. Living one day at a time without any change in sight leaves one "empty".

The Matthew project is based on the pillars of love, trust and respect, and treats people as persons with an interest in improving the individuals current situation and future prospects. This leads to focusing on accessing a "home" while caring for them in their current circumstance.

Every Thursday evening at 6:30 the program meets at their Rupert Street building (1815 Rupert Street) to prepare food and drink to take to the homeless people in Regina. They pack their bus with sandwiches, soup, coffee, juice, and clothing to hand out to homeless persons downtown. In the process of meeting some of the immediate personal needs members sit to listen to these friends building a relationship based on their three pillars. 75 to 100 people attend these meetings 3 out of 4 Thursdays each month.

The project is run by volunteers and is funded by donations and church friends. The goal is to move their "clients from the lost and homeless to "home dwellers with purpose in life". The project is looking to develop a partnership with Phoenix House and their "housing first" initiative.

From their project it would seem there are a minimum of 20 people in Regina who are permanent street dwellers, with many more temporary street people, whose lives are interspersed with couch surfing among friends. Matthew Project's hope is to one day establish a temporary lodging facility for homeless people which can be used as a "crash" place while searching for a more permanent arrangement.

President Richard thanked Keith for his presentation and wished the Matthew Project much success as they continue their important work in making "home" real for all Regina citizens. Keith also received an insulated bag.



#### THIS IS MY LIFE WITH PATRICK MASVOSVA

Patrick grew up in a family of four in what is now Zimbabwe. He suggested that his parents were "strict" and that this meant "discipline" was well understood. Following completing elementary school in his community he was sent off to a "secondary" Methodist school. Sadly the student body in the school had an "initiation" process that for boys required going to a specific place where a quantity of beer would be consumed. The intention was to get back into the school without detection. This did not work well for Patrick as his drunken state was immediately detected by the staff, and as such behaviour would not be tolerated he was expelled from school and sent home.



Patrick had a clear understanding of what would happen when he arrived at home and interestingly his parents



merely ignored his presence all afternoon and evening, not inviting him to the table for the evening meal. Before retiring the parents told him that he could have something to eat, he could sleep in his room and in the morning he could return to his favoured beer drinking practice by going to the liquor store down the street. It seemed that all members of his family were aware of his indiscretion and referred to his desired beer drinking lifestyle. Obviously, this approach had a lasting impact on our new Rotarian and he vowed not to drink another beer until a certain goal had been achieved.

Many goals have since been achieved because of his focused approach and he presents as a wise determined individual, who is a great asset to our Club and the community of Regina. Thank you Patrick for opening this portion of your life story to us. We are honoured to have you as a member of Regina Eastview.

## **ROTARY TIDBIT**

Rotary International President-elect Sam F. Owori died unexpectedly on 13 July due to complications from surgery. Sam was a member of the Rotary Club Kampala, Uganda, for 38 years.

"Rotary has become a way of life for me – with the intrinsic value and core belief in mutual responsibility and concern for one another as a cornerstone," Sam said when he was nominated last year. "I feel immense satisfaction knowing that through Rotary, I've helped someone live better."

Sam's term as Rotary's 108th president would have begun on 1 July 2018.

"Please remember Sam as the outstanding, hardworking Rotarian he was," said
Rotary International President Ian Riseley. "In this difficult time, I ask you to keep his wife, Norah, the Owori family, and Sam's millions of friends around the world in your thoughts."
Under Sam's leadership, the number of clubs in Uganda swelled from nine to 89 over the course of 29 years.

Sam saw in Rotary members "an incredible passion to make a difference," and wanted to "harness that enthusiasm and pride so that every project becomes the engine of peace and prosperity."
