PROGRAM

Today's program was none other than President Greg McNamara, who provided a verbal report on the McNamara's trip to the Rotary International Convention in Seoul, Korea.

Greg began by expressing his deepest appreciation for: first, being selected to serve as President of Regina Eastview; and, then being gifted with the opportunity for he and Anne to attend the Convention in Seoul. The following are some of the things we learned from President Greg's report:



• An early flight from Regina got the McNamara's into Vancouver at breakfast time, allowing for a train ride into the heart of Vancouver;



- There in the epi-centre of this huge City was a surprizing mass of homeless people;
- It took some getting used to the time difference (between Regina and Seoul there is a 15 hour difference);
- Arriving in Seoul they saw more homeless people, but seemingly better looked after than in Vancouver;
- In Korea there were health care workers going about checking on the needs of the homeless and addressing urgent situations;
- After sleeping for a time, they took a day to orient themselves to their surroundings;
- The population of Seoul is 10.3 million people which expands to 25 million when considering Seoul's metropolitan area ;
- Their hotel was three blocks from the centre of the City;
- City Hall was, "Like out of a Star Wars Movie";





• South Korea and certainly Seoul has undertaken a miraculous regeneration since the 1950's Korean War;

• The streets are filled with Street Vendors – they even set up their stations on stairwells;

• There were 50,000 people registered for the RI convention which was held at Kintex, 16 km from Seoul;

• Rotarians from around the world come to the convention and are attired in their native dress which adds to a spectacular colour filled atmosphere;

• The opening speaker at the Convention was the Secretary

General of the United Nations, Ban Ki-moon;

- Ban Ki-moon commended Rotary for our involvement in setting up the United Nations in 1945 and for our strong leadership in the eradication of Polio'
- Food was absolutely fabulous;
- At the President Elect Dinner, Greg and Anne were invited to sit at the table reserved for PRI President Ron (right) and Jenna Burton (2013-2014) from the Rotary Club of Norman, Oklahoma; and.
- In September we get the photo travelogue with Greg and Anne McNamara stay tuned.

Rousing applause followed. Thank you, Greg.
