

Program: Doreen Pankewich, a former long time employee and friend for 34 years, introduced guest speaker, Terry Simonson COO and President of the Jay's Transportation Group. Terry and the people at Jay's are an organization near and dear to Eastview as they have made many significant contributions to Eastview projects. Terry was born and raised in Saskatoon. He joined Jay's in 1979 and has held many positions in the organization. He moved to Regina in 2009 to his current position with the company. He is the past president of the Saskatoon Transportation Club and the Yellowhead Cosmopolitan Club. He is currently a member of the Regina Capital Cosmopolitan Club and the Saskatchewan Trucking Association. Terry and his partner Angie, enjoy spending time with family.

Terry came to the podium to tell us more about Jay's and the philosopy of the company. "If you spend a dollar, you need to get a dollar twenty back," the founder and owner of Jay's Moving & Storage Ltd.,

Dennis Doehl, learned as a young man. And it's one that he applied to his business daily as Jay's grew steadily from a 3-truck operation to what it is today; one of the largest multibranch moving and freight companies operating in the prairie provinces, with 11 branches in Saskatchewan and 1 in Alberta, 500 employees, and over 600 pieces of equipment. Jay's handles 34,000 shipments per month. Over 99% are claim free. Terry



noted that the owner encouraged his employees to join a service club. Terry joined a Cosmopolitan club in Saskatoon. In 1970, Jay's leased a warehouse in Regina and became an agent for Atlas Van Lines Canada,

a partnership which continues today. Employee safety is a priority for Jay's and new technology has made it possible for many new safeguards. He cautioned us to be aware of the company you hire.

Jay's involvement in the community is extensive. They support many local community organizations and the MS Society. Jay's is a major sponsor of the Kinsmen Telemiracle Foundation and hosts an annual golf tournament that has raised over a million dollars for Telemiracle. As part of their 50 year celebration, Jay's helped a community each week of the year e.g. a swimming pool was built in Raymore. Jay's also supports breast and ovarian cancer fundraisers. Every year they form the world's largest convoy of 10-12 trucks and trailers that



travel from Saskatoon to Chamberlain to Regina and donate proceeds to a charity. As of June 1/2013 Jay's Group of Companies operates as a subsidiary of Mullen Group Ltd. Following Terry's presentation, Doreen Pankewich presented him with a plaque thanking Jay's for their contributions to Eastview. Terry indicated that the support will continue and thanked the Club for the Paul

Harris award he received at the Valentine Gala. There is mutual admiration and respect between Jay's and the Rotary Club of Regina Eastview. Thank you Jay's (and Terry) for your support over the years to our Club. It is greatly appreciated.
