**2015-2016 Service Awards** – In view of their absence at the Changeover meeting on June 17<sup>th</sup>, President Ron called Louis Browne Regina Eastview Membership Director and Treasurer Jizinge Mwela to join him at the podium and accept a token of his appreciation for their service to the Club during the past year. Congratulations, Gentlemen.

#### **PROGRAM**

President Ron introduced guest speaker Chris Siddons, the Provincial Coordinator of **OSI-CAN** (Operational Stress Injury) Support Initiative. From Ron we learned Chris was born in England and joined the Queens Guard

when he was 16. He did tours in Iraq and Kuwait and in Northern Ireland. He was in Iraq during Desert Storm in 1991. He came to Canada in 2005. From Chris we learned that he was diagnosed with PTSD in 2014; has had a Service Dog since January 2015; has connected with a "faith" community – and these three factors allowed him to "turn his world around".

**OSI-CAN** was created in January 2016 to assist Veterans and First Responders in Saskatchewan who suffer from Operational Stress Injury and Post Traumatic Stress. Their Mission is: *To inspire hope and contribute to the continuous wellbeing of Veterans and Community First Responders*. "All the while focused on their Vision: *We seek to empower and encourage Veterans and First Responders to strive for recovery through peer and professional support*."







Their Peer Group includes Canadian Armed Forces, Allied Armed Forces, RCMP, Municipal Police Services, EMS, Fire and Protection, Correction Services and 911 Dispatchers. **OSI-CAN** is supported by a Steering Committee from a host of professional and support organizations including CMHA Saskatchewan Division, RCMP, Royal Canadian Legion, Pharmacist, Psychologists, Psychiatrists and Service Animal Providers. Working with the Steering Committee they are able to strategize how to meet their goals which include:

- Provide educational and informational sessions for clients;
- Continue to raise funds for further growth of the OSI-CAN Initiative to other areas of the Province;
- Successfully pair 2 Service Dogs with handlers in the first year;
- Successfully pair 6 service dogs with handlers in year 2;
- Continue to support the Target group and their families;
- A 15 year Business Plan is in place.

Chris indicated the work of OSI-CAN now has established Peer Support groups on Regina, Saskatoon, Prince



Albert and Weyburn. In addition **OSI-CAN's** attention is focused on public education (distribution of posters and pamphlets; interaction with media; seeking out business partners and lining up donation support; and, attending public and community events (like meeting with Rotary) to promote the Initiative and raise awareness.

Donations can be made directly to **OSI-CAN** if no tax receipt is required; if a tax receipt is desired donations can be made to CMHA. In this case donors are asked to make note that the donation is to **OSI-CAN**.

Chris responded to a great number of questions from members before President Ron thanked him for an interesting and informative presentation.
