
Lead Table: the following people had the

Presentation: President Ron presented Gord Wicijowski with an RI pin for sponsoring a new member, Laurel Mattison. This is a new RI initiative. Congratulations Gord and again, welcome Laurel.

Program: This was a special program which made Eastview Rotarians proud to sponsor programs involving youth. Allen Hillsden came to the podium to introduce Isabel Gagne, Eastview's representative to the MUNA (Model United Nations Assembly) program held in Winnipeg earlier this year. Isabel was accompanied today by her mother, Katherine Gagne. It took us only a moment to realize the capabilities of this young student. Isabel is a high honors grade 12 student at Harvest City Christian Academy. In 2015 she was recognized by the Lieutenant Governor as Saskatchewan's Junior Citizen of the year and by the Congress of Aboriginal Peoples with the National Youth Achievement Award. In 2016 the YWCA recognized Isabel at the Women of Distinction Awards as "Young Woman of Promise" and the SaskTel Youth Aboriginal Awards gave Isabel the top honor of Outstanding Achievement. She is the granddaughter of former cabinet minister, Graham Taylor.

Isabel has accepted an offer to study International Business at McGill University this fall and was awarded the



highest prestige renewable scholarship (The Greville Smith Scholarship). As well Isabel was just recognized with the TD Community Leadership Scholarship for a total offering of over \$100,000. Isabel's achievements in her school and community are equally outstanding.

Isabel then came to the podium and with the help of Power Point, told us of her experience at MUNA. Her fellow classmate, Courtney Thrun, was also to attend MUNA but minutes before they were scheduled to leave, Courtney was having her arm casted following a fracture in a volleyball game so could not attend MUNA.

Isabel thanked Eastview for providing her the opportunity to attend this program. The days were

full and the schedule busy. Isabel represented India at the conference. She enjoyed the deep conversations, learning about India and about the United Nations. She was thankful to have her computer with her as there was much research to be done during the sessions. The note passing was unexpected and kept her thinking and researching to find answers and, of course, all answers had to be from India's perspective. She constantly had to remind herself she was speaking for India. She had to prepare a positional statement on India's stance on nuclear proliferation. This process gave her a depth of understanding on many levels. She said she matured significantly at this conference and the experience will serve her well in the future.

Following her presentation, Isabel received questions about her experience. Her mother, Katherine, came to podium to offer further thanks to Eastview for giving Isabel this opportunity. As Chair of the Regina School Board, Katherine noted that she saw in this program a level of education not seen before. She complemented Eastview on this wonderful program and for the work Rotarians do for the community and the world.

President Ron presented gifts to Katherine and Isabel and thanked them for attending and noted that youth is a very good investment for Rotary.

Announcements: Allen Hillsden thanked Laurel for her gift to him last week and for the card signed by members. He then reminded us of the Eastview Golf Tournament to be held Friday July 8. Prizes are needed as well as hole sponsors.

More about MUNA

Rotary International stimulated and participated in the events leading up to the establishment of the United Nations Organization. It was present at the signing of the United Nations Charter in San Francisco in 1945. The Rotary Club of Winnipeg, established in 1910, was the first club outside the United States, thus making Rotary international. It was fitting, therefore, that the Club should organize a Rotary Model United Nations Assembly (MUNA) as an initial venture in promoting international understanding among youth.

The Model United Nations Assembly is purported to be a learning simulation of the United Nations General Assembly in its structure and proceedings. Therefore, debates in MUNA, the committee structure, rules of procedure, and the general decorum of delegates, were designed to approximate the UN General Assembly, conditioned, of course, by local limitations.

With the assistance of the then Winnipeg Branch of the Canadian Institute of International Affairs and Winnipeg Branch of the United Nations Association, the Rotary Club of Winnipeg held the first MUNA on April 26 and 27, 1957. The success of the first Assembly prompted the Club to hold one every year since, with only three lapses; in 1966 due to the Red River Flood conditions, in 1986 due to a Measles epidemic, and in 1997 upstaged by the Flood of the Century.

MUNA celebrated its 50th anniversary in conjunction with the May 2007 Assembly. A gala dinner and dance marked the occasion. The Rotary Club of Winnipeg congratulates all MUNA participants over the last fifty years and we look forward to the next half century.
