NEW MEMBER INDUCTION

Louis Browne, Director of the Club's Membership Committee was called on to preside over the induction of four individuals into the Rotary Club of Regina Eastview. Louis invited the individuals and their sponsors to join him at the podium. Each sponsor was asked to introduce the individual they were presenting - this began with Louis introducing



of Joseph Mburu. Joseph is an assistant professor at the University of Regina teaching political science and international studies. Louis touched on Joseph's qualifications noting his intention to return to his native Kenya and run for president.

Jeff Barber was called on to introduce Ted Kent. In his comments Jeff referred to Ted's post-secondary education at the University of Saskatchewan in political science and Government. Ted Kent's vocational career has focused on insurance and banking Ted is currently General Manager, Banking Centre Leader at CIBC.

Doug Mortin had the pleasure of introducing Hussein Ibrahim, a graduate in Medicine from an Egyptian Medical School. Following this Hussein took additional medical education and training in London, England receiving a postgraduate diploma in Psychiatry. Further study in medical research in Florence, Italy earned him a European Union certificate followed by a Master's degree at University of Maastricht, Holland. Hussein studied Sexual Medicine and has been licensed from the European Board and recently the American Board and is preparing to soon establish his own business: The Psychosexual Clinic Canada. He is currently working with the disability domain at Ranch Ehrlo Society, Autism Services with the Ministry of Health and Cognitive Disability Strategy with the Ministry of Social Services.



Louis Browne then concluded the introductions by recognizing Chad Cunningham. A former Rotarian, Chad was being welcomed back to Rotary within the Regina Eastview community. A career advertising consultant, Chad is currently employed as a Media & Sr. Advertising Consultant at Rawlco Radio. Chad has a passion for helping



non-profit groups having experiences from the point of view of an owner, manager, and as the sales/marketing person giving him a multidimensional perspective. As an advertising consultant, Chad's goal has always been to make it a triple win. A win for his clients, the company for whom he works and a win for himself.

In his Induction comments Director Louis, challenged the inductees and all Rotarians to be mindful of the challenges encompassed in the Object of Rotary, and the dictates of the Four-Way Test. Touching on the privileges afforded through Rotary, Louis also emphasized the responsibilities that fall to us as Rotarians. In his concluding comments Louis Browne noted Regina Eastview has loaned Joseph Mburu the Classification of Professor – Political Science & International Studies; Chad Cunningham the Classification of Advertising Consultant; Ted Kent the Classification of Retail Banking; and, Hussein Ibrahim the Classification CEO Psychosexual Clinic of Canada.



Acting President Doreen presented each Inductee with Rotary information, framed Object of Rotary, framed Rotary Four-Way Test, and the Rotary pin. The Inductees and their sponsors formed a "receiving line" and members of Eastview each had opportunity to welcome the newest members into the world of Rotary.

PROGRAM

Wally Dressler introduced our guest speaker Nola Ayers, who came to speak to us about Grandmothers for Grandmothers. He noted that Nola had a health care career in what is now known as the Five Hills Health Region. Her story today is associated with a Grandmothers to Grandmothers visit she had to Uganda in concert with The Stephen Lewis Foundation.

Ms. Ayers initially introduced us to the Stephen Lewis Foundation which was created in 2003. To date the Foundation has invested \$89 Million in 15 African countries in addressing the trauma created by the HIV AIDS.



It is well known that it is Grandmothers who are keeping families together in response to the impact HIV AIDS has had on an entire generation of African men and women.

The Stephen Lewis Foundation is in the top 25 highly respected Foundations in Canada, as it keeps its operating costs below 10% of contributions received. This requires its volunteers to cover the costs of their participation in various programs like going on the trip to Uganda last year. The Foundation provides both short term and long term support with the latter providing grief counseling, HIV counseling and education.

A component of the visit to Uganda was participation in a large Grandmothers to Grandmothers Conference which gathered together 500 plus grandmothers from around the world. The conference demonstrated the power of the Grandmother voices for they held the feet of Government officials to the fire being quick to challenge statements made by

Government officials. The African grandmothers were most appreciative of grandmothers coming from around the world to join them in addressing the challenges they face in this health crisis. By working together grandmothers demonstrate that, "we grow stronger as a human family".

Grandmothers for Grandmothers in Regina meets once a month with the exception of two months and over the course of their history have raised in excess of \$500,000.00. Money is raised in various ways including "attic sales", farmers markets, dinner speakers, etc. On April 30th Stephen Lewis daughter, Ilana Naomi Landsberg-Lewis, Executive Director of the Stephen Lewis Foundation, will be the guest speaker at a major Fund raising dinner in Regina.

Past President Doreen expressed our collective appreciation to Nola Ayers for their important work.
