

NEW MEMBER INDUCTION



For the second week in a row it was New Member Induction time. Today Membership Committee member PDG Doug Mortin was called to the podium to preside over the induction of Kell Sloane into the Rotary Club of Regina Eastview. Doug invited Allen Hillsden to introduce Kell.

From Allen we learned Kell, a business developer, refers to himself as a "reformed bluenoser" having taken up residence in Regina 6 months ago. Our newest member is in the business

of creating long-term value for organizations from their customers, markets and relationships. Kell is completing course work for a Masters of Business Administration degree through the Edinburgh Business School. His wife, Kim and their children, Samantha and Colin, will be joining him in Regina in the next two weeks.

In his Induction comments Doug Mortin, touched on the privileges and responsibilities that fall to a member of Rotary, noting the community will judge Rotary by the action of its members. He encouraged Kell, and the rest of us, that living by the simple, yet challenging, dictates of the Four-Way Test we reflect a life style the community will recognize and appreciate.

In his concluding comments Doug Mortin advised Regina Eastview has loaned Kell Sloane the

PROGRAM

President Ron introduced our guest speakers, Scott and Janice Yule, who were invited to speak to us about their experience in the hosting of Syrian Refugee families to the Regina

Community. Janice and Scott married their respective "University sweetheart", forming a union which among other things resulted in three children; and, an exciting life in a variety of Canadian communities from the Maritimes to the Saskatchewan's capital.

The Yule's responded to the invitation to become involved in the resettlement of Syrian Refugees and did so through the Regina Open Door Society (RODS). Their involvement included taking their families shopping and to appointments.





Scott drew a comparison between the early settlers that came to Canada (and specifically the Prairies), with the challenges Syrian refugees face when they arrived in Regina early this year. The climate is new, as is the language, and the culture. Before becoming refugees some families were well off, then lost everything. Refugees come knowing they will have support for one year, but then they will be on their own. As a result they want to learn the language so they can get a job and care for their family. They shared the challenges of communication; the joy of learning to understand together; the warmth of doing a good thing; being appreciated by the children as if they are grandparents; and, dealing with emotion that comes from receiving gifts from people who have little but share with humble thankfulness.

They assisted families as they relocated from the hotel to their new homes; struggled up multi flights of stairs carrying the heaviest of oak tables; appreciated their resourcefulness in making do; and, marvelled at the commitment these new neighbours have to a good life in Regina.

If you want to volunteer in Refugee resettlement call Bonnie at the RODS and find out what there is to do and how you might help.

President Ron thanked Janice and Scott for their presentation and for what they do in creating a new home for the new residents of Canada.

Family of Rotary – It was very good to have Mary Rogers at the meeting today. Mary told us Lloyd is no longer able to come to Rotary, and while he is able to participate in a day program at the Wascana Rehabilitation Centre, he is no longer able to participate in activities of the Club. Let us keep Lloyd and Mary in our thoughts and make it a point of following up with them in the weeks and months ahead.

Also, "Recent forest fires in Fort McMurray: A state of emergency has been declared in Alberta due to the "dynamic, ever-changing situation" of the forest fires that have devastated Fort McMurray and surrounding areas. The 7,500 hectare wildfire has destroyed 1,600 buildings and is expected to grow to 10,000 hectares. The wild fire has forced up to 90,000 residents to evacuate Fort McMurray.

ShelterBox has offered our assistance and is monitoring the situation to see if we are needed. It appears that most families are staying in community centers and schools, it is unclear at the moment if the ShelterBox solution will be required."

Fort McMurray Fire Relief Fund Established - The Rotary District 5370 Charitable Foundation has established the "Fort McMurray Fire Relief Fund" to assist in the rebuilding of that city following this tragic fire. The Charitable Foundation is now ready to accept donations, for which tax receipts will be issued. The Foundation



will rely on an independent committee of Fort McMurray stakeholders (including the Rotary club and the municipality) for advice on disbursal of the funds.

This fund is being established after consultation with DGN Frank Reitz (resident of Fort McMurray) and Fort McMurray Rotary Club President Jeanette Bancarz.

Donations may be from individuals or corporations. Rotary clubs may wish to facilitate this process by collecting donations,

and then forwarding either the individual cheques or a cheque drawn on the club's account for the total amount, along with a list of the donors and their addresses and postal codes.
