

PROGRAM

Cary Carlson was invited to introduce guest speaker, Colonel (Retired) Charles Keple, on the topic "Let's we forget" (sic) (now that Remembrance Day is over.). A lot of what Gary included in the introduction was missed so this is what I learned from Google about our distinguished guest: Colonel Keple enlisted in 1958, and

acquired unique military breadth





with regular and reserve service spanning army, air force and international command and staff appointments. A Regina native, he was a rifleman, a gunner, a BEng (Civil), who served in 2 and 4Fd SqnRCE [with 2nd BR Div (Germany)]. An honour graduate of the British Technical Staff, Canadian Command & Staff, and National Defence College courses, he qualified as both a Combat and an Airfield Engineer. He held senior staff appointments in Canadian Forces HQ, Air Command HQ, Mobile Command HQ, HQ Allied Forces Central Europe, and Supreme HQ Allied Powers Europe. He was Director General Military Engineering Operations at National Defence HQ during operations in Pakistan, Croatia, Kuwait, Somalia, Cambodia, and Bosnia. In 1996 he was transferred to the Supplementary Reserve, and retired in 2007.

A gifted instructor/facilitator/teacher/mentor, our friend Charles Keple used a Rotary Leadership Institute (RLI) process to drive home an important Remembrance Day point. Using the Object of Rotary as a base, Charles challenged us, by table, to respond four basic Object understandings. Giving one table a "passing grade" while the rest of us failed. Charles suggested that if as a group of dedicated Rotarians did not know why Rotary existed, is it any wonder that the general population does not know or understand the impact of Remembrance Day.

Sharing his personal perspective, Charles noted Remembrance Day is set aside to remember, "The glorious dead". But should we not also honour the injured, physically and mentally, who return battered. The thrust of this day is focused on those who died in "war". Why, Charles wondered, "Why not on those who died in peace keeping". He noted that 3402 persons died as part of United Nations Peace Keeping Forces (122 Canadians) – they too are part of the glorious dead.



Charles suggested that the "enemy" or the "foe" referenced *In Flanders Fields* should not be viewed as a person, country, or culture, but rather evil. It is evil that we must defeat. Rotarians, with our commitment to world understanding and peace are positioned to provide important leadership to achieving this end.

Thank you, Charles for sharing your learned perspective. It was an honour to have you speak to the Rotary Club of Regina Eastview.

Lyle Gollnick a member of the Club's Community Services Committee was called on to make a special presentation. Lyle invited Susan Berg to join him at the podium. Lyle presented Susan with the Club's donation to the Canadian Mental Health Association. From the Rotary Weekly News - November 6, 2015




Dr. Deborah K. W. Walters a member of the Rotary Club of Unity, Maine (D 7790) was one of 6 "Global Women of Action" Rotary honoured on November 7th during the annual Rotary Day at the United Nations in New York. Because of her work in Guatemala, Deborah Walters has been a helpful connection for the Ripple Effect Program and particularly Program Coordinators, Deb and Gord LeMaistre.

- Dr. Deborah Walters is a neuroscientist by profession with training in physics and engineering with professional academic experience at Unity College, the State University of New York and the University of Birmingham (UK).
- She has served as the director and supporter Safe Passage (Camino Seguro) a Maine registered non-profit organization that helps to provide educational and social services to the children and families who live in the Guatemala City garbage dump.
- During her time a District Governor she lead an initiative, in partnership with Behrhorst Partners for Development and a Guatemalan Rotary Club, to improve water systems and build latrines for people living in and around the dump.
- She was honored as Rotarian of the Year by her club in 2015.
