In his comments Allen noted that Jack was born in Regina but lived a good portion of his growing up years in Edmonton, with a return or two to Regina, I expect to remain rooted. Jack initial vocation was in a business venture with a very good friend, which was very successful until the sudden passing of his business partner. During



PROGRAM

In introducing today's program, President Ron indicated there would be two speakers, both members of the Club. Allan Smith shared his, "This is my Life" story arranged by our Membership's Committee. This introduces new members to the Club and re-introduces veteran members who are not well known to members, particularly those who recently joined Eastview.



Program Part 1 - Allan broke his presentation into two components: i) What have I contributed to Rotary; and, ii) What have I gained from Rotary. Allan's introduction to Rotary was in 1944-45, in his senior year at Balfour Collegiate, he was selected as one of two students from his school to participate in a program of the Rotary Club of Regina involving young people which included attending 4 luncheon meetings of the Club. 25 years later (February 1970) he was invited to join Regina Eastview where he has now served for 45 years.

Contribution to Rotary - Allan touched on the roles he has played in the Club which included seven years as Secretary, before serving as President

in 1982-83. He served on the

International Service Committee; Adventures in Agriculture Committee; and most recently on Community Services Committee. He and Beth were involved in the hosting of Rotary Exchange Students. On numerous occasions they also home hosted Group Study Exchange Team members that were visiting District 5550.

District involvement included serving as District Secretary for Sam McKee and Glen Stinson during their District Governor years. In 1996 Allan was the District's Group Study Exchange Leader of a Team that spent 5 weeks in RI District 4320 Chile, an exciting vocational and cultural experience where his Spanish classes paid real dividends. A highlight of their visit to Chile was participating in the District Conference where they made their presentation in Spanish. Allan was also involved in an international project in Argentina which brought water to a community.

Personal Gain from Rotary – Allan observed that he has gained many valued Rotary friends from around the world. International friends that came about in large part because he and Beth had the privilege of attending a number of Rotary International Conferences. Opportunities were opened for local and international participation which were experienced because of Rotary. An enjoyable and worthwhile weekly experience.



Program Part 2 - Peter Peters was invited to speak about The Rotary Foundation's new program - Vocational Training Teams (VTT). This is a program which in essence replaced Group Study Exchange, making the vocational component of this international experience more deliberately focused. VTT's must address at least one of TRF's six areas of Focus; must "build capacity" of either the team members or the benefiting community; have sustainable and measurable impact; and, must involve Rotary clubs or districts in two countries. There is no age restriction on Team members who can be Rotarians or non-Rotarians. Members must have a

minimum of 2 years professional experience in the area of focus. The leader while preferably a Rotarian, must have international experience, Rotary knowledge and of course vocational experience in the area of focus.

Peter noted that the District is in the process of sending a team of teachers to Ethiopia. Initial steps have been exploring the interest in District 4250 (Guatemala) to have a VTT of teachers from their District visit our District to experience teaching in Canada. Certainly, a very specific program would need to be developed to make this a meaningful endeavour. (Left – Guatemala - Joya Verde Kindergarten class October 2015)
