**Program:** Ann Grahame introduced Krishan Kapila, a return visitor to Eastview, to tell us about the continuing success of the Saskatchewan Visual Art Project. This is the 7<sup>th</sup> year of the project started by Krishan, who is a former science teacher, and his friend in Saskatoon. It offers a way for teens, particularly troubled teens, to

express themselves, through art, their faith and spirituality. Ann noted that Krishan was the first recipient of the 'Service Above Self Award' from the Rotary Club of Regina Eastview. The Club provides \$500 a year to this project through the Community Services Committee.

Kishan taught in India and then came to Canada in 1969-he noted that he landed in Canada as men were landing on the moon. He was soon successful in finding employment. He spoke of the changes that have taken place in the past 50 years in transportation, technology, the increased population and how everything is moving faster. As a teacher he has witnessed many changes. Sometimes we judge people on the outside while inside is the real person. 'The purpose of the project is to encourage and assist students to create art that will celebrate all those

things that make life better for you, for all of humankind and the planet.'

The project is open to all Grade 9-12 art classes in the province. Up to fifteen pieces of student art will be recognized with medals and certificates of recognition and with cash awards. There will be a reception on April 13, 2019 at the MacKenzie Art Gallery from 2-4 pm. All art will be returned to the students except for the 15 pieces that will go on tour for the year across the province. After the tour the art will be returned to the students.



The criteria is being updated to include digital art and receipt of entries digitally. Access Communications will produce a presentation for download on the website. The messages from the art will go far and wide.

Volunteers are welcomed for the project. Following the presentation Jack thanked Krishan and presented him with three Rotary blue bags.
