

ECOSUPERIOR

The Club welcomed two groups making presentations on Environmental project here in Thunder Bay.

The first was Eco-Superior, who described a research project "Litter Free Lake Superior" currently underway in the City, in which human generated litter is captured using 16 screens inserted into storm drains at various locations. Since the storm drains are untreated, any contaminants washed into the system are flushed into Lake Superior.

Perhaps surprisingly, one of the largest fractions of this human generated litter is cigarette butts/filters. Plastics also form part of the pollutants. With the rising concern around micro-plastics it is obviously undesirable to have plastics in the lake breaking down into small particles. As the collection screens are limited, to date, the data collection has been focused on key areas within the city.

The proponents of the study wish to acquire both additional screens and larger screens to allow more data to be obtained. Currently the Federal and Provincial Governments fund the project but Eco-Superior is looking to forge alliances with a local sponsor.

The second presentation was by the Lakehead Conservation Authority. The representatives outlined the "Seeds for Conservation" program, in place for the past 4 years, utilizing native plants to restore and rehabilitate vacant or brownfield sites. In that time, 4500 plants have been grown "in house" and approximately 12,000 have been planted.

The program emphasizes the use of ethical and sustainable seed harvesting seed harvesting practices to ensure that existing growth remains viable.

Once the seeds are harvested, they are cleaned and stored. To mimic the winter temperature changes that the seed would experience in nature, they are "stratified" either through exposure outside in protective containers or, if stored indoors, through refrigeration.

Some of the challenges the program faces are greenhouse space, room for the germination process, seed cleaning process refinements to reduce the labour requirement and cold frame capacity.

The Conservation Authority has a number of opportunities for volunteer assistance as part of the ongoing program. They also would welcome support of groups within the Community. For further information see: https://lakeheadca.com/stewardship
