## **LAST MEETING**

The Club welcomed Michelle Gibson representing "Rowantree Collective", an organization that was formed in support of post-secondary school aged young adults with autism or other exceptionalities. The organization is a privately funded not-for-profit with facilities at 280 Park Avenue here in Thunder Bay.

The Collective focuses on five program branches representing important aspects of daily living necessary for a meaningful life:

- Recreation and Entertainment (movie nights, board games, etc.)
- Health and Wellness (outdoor excursions, nutritional awareness, mental health strategies, etc.)
- Active Citizenship (working at the Dew Drop Inn, weekly news program, voting)
- Life Skills (Cooking, cleaning, etc.)
- Employment and Volunteerism (Dew Drop Inn delivery assistance, Both Hands Pizza work opportunity baking, cooking/serving)

This programming aims to help their members achieve a life filled with dignity, pride and enjoyment.

Michelle and her husband Paul saw a need for people like their son Rowan, his longtime friend Noah and other neurodiverse young adults a continued opportunity to thrive as they transitioned out of the Secondary school system. They envisioned an inclusive and welcoming space that would foster friendship, belonging and a sense of community. The organizations vision is "To build a strong collective of neurodiverse members who have a sense of belonging in our community".

Starting with 6 participants in 2022, the organization now has 37 members with 5 engaged at Both Hands Pizza.

The Collective operates on a fee for service basis. Currently government funding goes directly to families who decide which resources/service providers they feel would be most effective for their young adults.
