# THE FORTARIAN Sept 13, 2023

The assembled Rotarians sang the National anthem, led by Laura Craig, after which Cynthia Judge proposed a toast to the King of Canada.

Mary Anne Breton acknowledged that the meeting was being conducted on the traditional lands of the Indigenous people of this region and recognizing the Metis people and their contributions in the history of the area.

#### Presentation:

Dawn Sebesta introduced the speakers for the evening, Lauren Biasiol, Amy Liao and Gwen Carrasco, Thunder Bay students who attended this summer's RYLA camp.



The young women expressed their gratitude to the Club for sponsorship and the opportunity of participating in the Leadership Camp.

The "Rylarians" shared:

- The highlights of their experience completing the program,
- Which of the "seven Habits of Highly Effective People" that they found most revealing,
- How they planned to use the information, experiences and techniques gained from participating in the program moving forward

Moving forward, a common plan for all three participants was to advocate for RYLA and its' lessons in their interactions with the community, personal relationships and to demonstrate the positive outcomes by virtue of their actions in day-to-day life.

The presentation demonstrated the degree to which each was positively impacted by their experience and each of their comments addressed an increased level of confidence, the importance of trust, a willingness to admit their vulnerability as a step in building relationships and confidence, the important guidance of the 4-way test and a need to be accountable for their actions.

The presentation ended with a second expression of gratitude to the Club for the opportunity to participate in this positive program, with special thanks extended to Dawn Sebesta for her effort in transporting them to the pick-up point and her friendship and guidance as they embarked on this adventure.

Dawn Sebesta thanked the presenters on behalf of the Club for sharing their positive experiences.
