Jill Zachary introduced our guest speaker, Karl Everett from the Duluth Harbourtown Rotary Club. Karl is a former professional engineer & geologist & also had a career in environmental health & safety.



Karl has participated in 4 different service projects in Bolivia, which is one of the poorest countries in the western hemisphere. Jill accompanied him both in 2015 & '17 & assisted locals in the building of a school in a remote village high in the Andes. Karl & 5 other intrepid Rotarians from 5580 made the trip again in the summer of 2018 to the same region & helped to build a medical clinic in the village of Jatun Mayu. The native people there are the direct descendants of the Inca tribes & they live on the slopes of mountains that tower over 16,000 feet. Our district has worked in conjunction with a group in that part of the world called "Mano a Mano" which was started in 1994 & has shipped surplus medical supplies worth more than \$14 million from Minnesota to South America over the past 24 years. Karl's next project is building a clinic in the Bolivian Amazon region which will be funded by Rotary. He's still looking for an additional \$12,000 in funding & welcomes any donations from District

clubs. He's also selling a Bolivian coffee called Velvet Hammer to help finance the project. He welcomed any interest from Rotarians who might consider joining the group travels next summer. Sante thanked Karl for his years of service to these less fortunate people who's average life expectancy is only 69!
