From Around the World

Togo



When an online friendship with a Togolese man underscored the limited access to washrooms in the West African nation, Doc Reiss decided to help find a solution. Reiss, a past president of the RC of Port Angeles WA. donated \$2000 toward selfcomposting concrete loos designed, in part, by the pen pal. "One day, he said he was getting really tired of going to the bushes" says Reiss. I asked what he meant and he explained that there was no indoor plumbing. Persistent flooding in the village prohibited outhouses. Reiss suggested self- composting toilets and both began research options. At more than \$1000 Boukari found and altered a design for a simple unit at \$350. The Togolese man built a toilet for his family and started making them for other local families. Word got back to Port Angeles and an article in the local newspaper helped raise over \$4000 was raised from the public.
