Dollywood Foundation has entered into an arrangement with Penquin Random House Canada to publish the vetted books as special Imagination Library printings. As an educator, I love the quality of the literature and the age appropriateness of the books.

Many Canadian books are among the publications. Indigenous communities across all the provinces and territories have embraced the program for its inclusion of Indigenous and Metis content.



How is Imagination Library Funded and Administered?

Dolly's Dollywood Foundation Canada funds our fulfillment centre and administrative salary for Dollywood Canada, established and funds the online registration site and promotional resources for affiliates. Dollywood has negotiated the procurement of age appropriate books at a nominal cost for affiliates through Random House/Penguin and manages delivery.

Imagination Library London raised funds to secure an endowment through London Community Foundation who provides all the donation system/website, fiscal tasks and oversight of our fundraising. Our all-volunteer group raises funds for the \$3.85 a month per book per child, promotes the program to families, registers children and provides support to families as needed.

Registering Families

Who receives Imagination Library Books?

Some families "just find us" through social media parent groups, TikTok, or word of mouth. Registered children, ages 0 to 5 years old, are mailed a high-quality, ageappropriate book monthly - free of charge to the family.

It is our goal to recruit in underserved, high needs communities in London -- through neighbourhood resource centres, Early ON playgroups, and through targeted school communities with TVDSB. Registration efforts are as active as fundraising. Sometimes agencies, institutions and groups who serve families may see it as "too good to be true" and need our active engagement for them to become partners with us.

Since we began registrations in the Fall of 2023, we are serving 300 children and have a waiting list of 100 children.


Why now? Why is Early Reading So Important?

"The single most important activity for building the knowledge required for eventual success in reading is reading aloud to children."

Why now . . . more than ever?

- The isolation of the pandemic affected social-emotional interaction and normal play.
- Post pandemic, screen time for those under 5 doubled.
- Inflation has affected food and housing insecurity
- Parental cell phone use when they are with their children has affected language development.

Before age 5 90% of a child's brain development happens





It Expands Vocabulary and Concept Development.

How many words does a child hear by age 5?

Based on these calculations, here's how many words kids would have heard by the time they were 5 years old:

- Never read to, 4,662 words;
- 1-2 times per week, 63,570 words;
- 3-5 times per week, 169,520 words;
- Daily, 296,660 words;
- Five books a day, 1,483,300 words

It Builds Reading Comprehension.

It builds background knowledge essential for future reading comprehension in all subjects including mathematics.

Logic Model




