The Rotary Citation is an award that recognizes clubs' hard work throughout the year. Taking action toward achieving the citation goals helps clubs engage their members, stay relevant in their communities, and run more efficiently.

A welcoming and engaging club also reflects the values of Rotary. When clubs work to achieve these goals, they also contribute to Rotary's overall health and culture for generations to come.

To be eligible for the Rotary Citation, presidents set measurable goals and track them throughout the year. There are 26 goals that can be selected to apply toward citation achievement. Clubs need to meet 13 of these goals. This flexibility allows clubs to choose the goals that are most relevant to their club.

So, on behalf of Rotary International and the District, congratulations to the 12 clubs in our district that received this recognition for the 2022-23 year and thank you for your club's efforts towards making the world a better place.

26th STRATFORD ROTARY DRAGON BOAT FESTIVAL: SEPTEMBER 16, 2023

Held on Lake Victoria in Stratford, this one-day festival will have over 40 teams participate in the recreational Hong Kong style races, including a 2000-meter final featuring the top 8 teams. The Grand Champion and Community Division Champions are honoured with trophies at the closing ceremony.

Over 2,000 will attend to watch the races and enjoy the food, refreshments, entertainment, and Kid's Tent. Proceeds from the event support Rotary community activities with over \$930,000 raised to date!

- Race Course Length - 500 metres or 1640.4 feet
- Number of lanes - 4
- Lane width - 10 metres or 33 feet
- Number of boats - 8
- 2,000 metre races for the top 8 teams



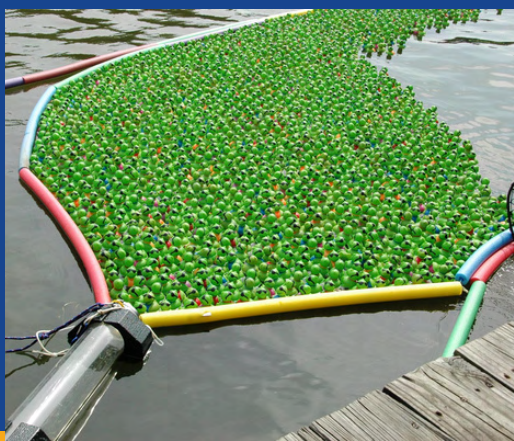
Pine River Turtle Race

ROTARY CLUB OF ST CLAIR

With the loss of St Clair Rotary's largest fundraiser in 2020 during COVID, their Freighter Raffle (a trip on a Great Lakes Freighter from St Clair, MI to Duluth MN and back), they needed to shift gears. Out of those gears came the idea of a Turtle Race on the Pine River in St Clair. The race is similar to the Rubber Duck races most clubs are familiar with.

St Clair Rotarians sell tickets with numbers that correspond to the numbers on the turtles, and the turtles are dumped into the river all at once (4,000+ Turtles). The first 3 turtles in the tube at the finish line win \$1,500 for first prize, \$1,000 for second prize, and \$500 for third. After the winners are determined, there is

an additional dip of turtles for door prizes. The success of the event is not only the hard work of the St Clair Rotarians, but the collaboration with local businesses to set them up as "Adoption Centers", selling the tickets for incentive prizes to those selling the most tickets. Race day includes the singing of the National Anthem, and the emcee giving the order for the turtle drop from a specially designed turtle hopper on a front-end loader. Then the excitement happens, and they're off to the races. It is a fun event and is well attended by the community. After all, how many times do you get to see over 4,000 plastic turtles float down a river?

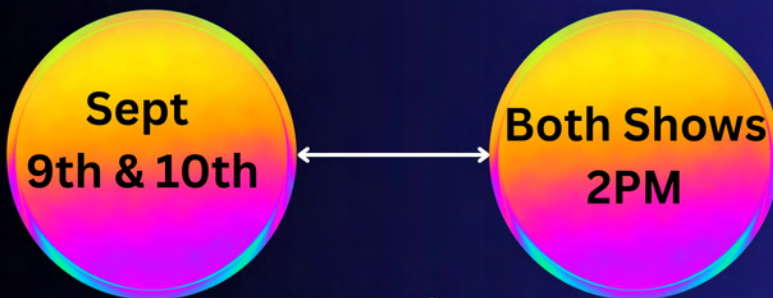

The Rotary Club of Sarnia Bluewaterland is really making a difference in their community this summer! The club is gearing up for its largest fundraiser of the year- Art in the Park. This event will be held at the Mike Weir Park in the Brights Grove area of the City of Sarnia on Saturday, Sept 9th. Art in the Park was initiated 30 years ago by a group of volunteers who were members of the Gallery in the Grove at Wildwood Park. In 2010 the RC of Sarnia-Bluewaterland entered into an agreement with the Gallery to assume the sponsorship of this major community event. [Click](#) here to learn more about this event.

In 2018 Rotarians of Sarnia Bluewaterland began the search for Rotarians in Kenya who would help provide water to a village of 3,000 people. That effort came to fruition on 23rd December 2022 when water gushed from the ground in Yombra near Lake Victoria. The Rotary Club of Kisumu Central has been working closely with the Sarnia Bluewaterland club to make water available to everyone. Their water project in Kenya is moving forward this month with the installation of the water tank and the village will be on this water system by end of September if all goes well.
