Southern Norfolk Sand Plains


Best opportunity to conserve the plants, wildlife and natural lands of Canada's Carolinian Zone

-Large intact forests, long and connected ravine and floodplain systems, globally rare coastal dunes and beaches, internationally significant wetlands

-More than 45 provincially, nationally or globally rare plants and animals – one of the highest densities of rare and endangered wildlife in Canada

-Multiple associated designations including UNESCO World Biosphere Reserve, Important Bird Area, ANSIs, PSWs etc








