The Children's Treatment Centre of Chatham-Kent is embarking on a huge project - they are hoping to build a new treatment centre.

One of our speakers this week was Rotarian Donna Litwin-Makey who is the executive director of the CK Treatment Centre.

She was joined by Mike Genge, executive director of the Foundation and Dan Lundy, a board member and a parent. His daughter uses some of the services of the Centre. Our speakers were introduced by Rotarian Sparky Leonard.

The Rotary Club has a long history of working with the Treatment Centre - going back to the days of the Easter Seals campaigns. Mike showed a slide showing Andy Watson, the chair of one of the the Easter Seals campaigns with "Timmy" of that year, Allan Campbell. The Rotary Club previously has raised \$250,000 for the centre.

The Children's Treatment Centre serves 1 in 9 of CK children and has 1,100 kids on the wait-list. There are 3,091 clients in 10 different communities. The staff in 1984 numbered 19, the staff today numbers 52. The caseload is expected to continue growing.

This necessitates a new facility. The Butterfly Building Campaign is raising funds for a new 50,000 sq. ft. building on McNaughton Ave. W.

The overall building costs are projected to be \$28.5 million with the ministry supplying \$22.5 million. The community needs to raise the remaining \$6 million. Approximately \$3.8 of this is already raised and \$2.3 million is still needed.

Mike is hoping that the Rotary Clubs in CK could help by raising \$250,000 for some of the outdoor areas of the new building.

This is an ambitious program that the fund-raising committee has undertaken and we wish them well. We were pleased to be given a sneak preview of the new facility. Past president Tom McCarthy thanked our guest speakers.


