This week, President Jennifer had a club assembly to discuss two items.

The first item was a proposal to invest \$8,000 with the Capitol Theatre to sponsor a show. This show would be an addition to their regular lineup.

The Rotary Club would be making a passive investment, with the Capitol Theatre responsible for selecting the show, promoting the show, and making all arrangements necessary to stage the presentation.

As a passive investor, the Rotary Club would share in any profits and be preferred to take a loss if the show is not well-attended.

The Rotary Club would be named as the sponsor of the show and members would be asked to support and promote the show.

If successful, it is the intention of the club that the original \$8,000 would be re-invested in another show and only the profits used for the Service Fund.

The motion was made, seconded and passed.

The second topic was a general discussion on our regular weekly meetings and our declining membership. One suggestion was that we might go to 2 meetings per month.

A good discussion followed with many other suggestions. No decision has been made at this point about changes to our weekly meetings.
